REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

John immersed, baptised, his followers in water, symbolising the washing away of the sins of the past. But he could not empower people by drenching them in the dynamic life of God. John anticipates 'Someone' (not named!) who does have the power to inundate, baptise, people with the Holy Spirit.

From the heading of St Mark's Gospel, we know that that 'Someone' is 'Jesus Christ, Son of God' who came to flood our lives with that Divine Power which can effect a completely new future for humanity.

That is why St Mark took the term 'gospel' (good news) which was used on inscriptions announcing an Emperor's birth or victory, and used it to describe his inspired rendering of the mission of Jesus Christ, which was to inaugurate the 'Kingdom of God', overcoming the pretensions of all Emperors of any kind throughout history. We could pause for a moment to thank God for the Good News of our being baptised with water in the 'Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.'

Brigid's Parish – Second Sunday of Advent (Year B)

<u>Introduction</u>: With the Second Sunday of Advent, the Church gives us the preaching of John the Baptist and his call to prepare a way for the Lord. Are we, too, ready to accept this challenge as we move towards Christmas?

<u>Lighting of Advent Candle</u> Christ, son of the living God, have mercy on us.

Response: We must decrease that you may increase.

1st **Reading:** Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11

These words from the prophet Isaiah are used by John the Baptist, when he announced that salvation is at hand.

2nd **Reading:** 2 Peter 3:8-14

In the early Christian community the expectation of Christ's return led to great fear and anxiety as to when that would take place. St. Peter urges the people to follow the teachings of the apostles.

Gospel: Mark 1:1-8

With the beginning of St. Mark's Gospel he begins by referring to Isaiah's preaching which he quotes, to call the people to listen.

<u>Prayer of Intercession:</u> As we embrace this season of Advent we ask God to comfort all who are in need, to gather the lost, and to lead all who seek his way of life.

1. We pray for the Pope and the College of Bishops, that they be like Isaiah's shepherds gathering the lambs, holding them close and leading them home.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

2. We pray for the assemblies of the Church, wherever they gather in Christ's name, that they may remove the things that hinder them from receiving Christ, but share his wisdom.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

3. We pray for the Year 6 students at Holy Cross School and St. Brigids School who are celebrating their Graduations at this time. We wish them every happiness and success in their future endeavours and thank our wonderful school staff who have cared for them during their Primary school years.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

4. We pray for the hungry, the oppressed or those in need: that through the generous support of our parish community every human person will receive what they need to live in dignity and peace.

(pause) We pray to the Lord

5. We pray for Ellie and Jake who will be Baptised in our parish this weekend. As you begin your faith journey, know that we are here to help and support you.

(pause) We pray to the Lord

6. We pray for those who are sick – especially those on our parish prayer list - and for all who care for them. For the faithful departed: those who have died recently and for those whose anniversaries occur at this time, especially *Nell Templeton*, *Alan Fisher & Frank Hvala*, that the promise of life beyond life and life in death will be the reward of their good and faithful service.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

Celebrant: In you, O Lord, kindness and truth meet, justice and peace embrace. Hear these petitions which we confidently bring before you today because you are a God who cares. We make our prayers through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Living Word

Second Sunday of Advent, Year B

10 December 2023

First Reading Isaiah

40:1-5. 9-11

A reading from the prophet Isaiah.

Prepare the way for the Lord.

'Console my people, console them' says your God.

'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.'

A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God across the desert. Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley; then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.'

Go up on a high mountain, joyful messenger to Zion. Shout with a loud voice, joyful messenger to Jerusalem. Shout without fear, say to the towns of Judah, 'Here is your God.' Here is the Lord coming with power, his arm subduing all things to him.

The prize of his victory is with him, his trophies all go before him. He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes.

- I will hear what the Lord God has to say, a voice that speaks of peace, peace for his people.

- 2. Mercy and faithfulness have met; justice and peace have embraced. Faithfulness shall spring from the earth and justice look down from heaven. (R.)

Second Reading

2 Peter 3:8-14

A reading from the second letter of St. Peter.

We wait for new heavens and a new earth.

There is one thing, my friends, that you must never forget: that with the Lord, 'a day' can mean a thousand years, and a thousand years is like a day.

The Lord is not being slow to carry out his promises, as anybody else might be called slow; but he is being patient with you all, wanting nobody to be lost and everybody to be brought to change his ways. The Day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then with a roar the sky will vanish, the elements will catch fire and fall apart, the earth and all that it contains will be burnt up.

Since everything is coming to an end like this, you should be living holy and saintly lives while you wait and long for the Day of God to come, when the sky will dissolve in flames and the elements melt in the heat. What we are waiting for is what he promised: the new heavens and new earth, the place where righteousness will be at home. So then, my friends, while you are waiting, do your best to live lives without spot or stain so that he will find you at peace.

Gospel Acclamation Luke 3:4. 6

Alleluia, alleluia!

Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths: all people shall see the salvation of God. *Alleluia!*

Gospel Mark 1:1-8

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark.

Make straight the paths of the Lord.

The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah:

Look, I am going to send my messenger before you:

he will prepare your way.

A voice cries in the wilderness:

Prepare a way for the Lord,

make his paths straight,

and so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'
