REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

St John's Gospel never calls John, 'the Baptist'. No, he is John the Witness: 'a witness to speak for the Light'. We discover in this Gospel that this light is embodied in Jesus Christ, most graphically portrayed in the Transfiguration when Christ's body is radiant, translucent, with Divine Light.

Jesus Christ is the light of the world, the One who came to liberate human beings from the many dark captivities which imprison them, the One who vanquished the inky blackness of the tomb.

We can become partakers in the life of this Divine Light. At baptism, this is symbolised by the lighting of a small candle from the great Easter candle which is sung into the church on the Easter Vigil as 'Christ our Light', the Conqueror of Death.

As a baptised people our allegiance to 'The Light' is not to be a private matter between 'me and God'. No, like John, we must bear witness to 'The Light' by being instruments of His power to dispel the darkness which can enshroud people's lives.

We could pause for a moment to commit ourselves to fulfil the promise of our baptismal candle so that we might more authentically celebrate the birth of the Divine Light come into human history.

Brigid's Parish – Third Sunday of Advent (Year B)

17th December 2023

<u>Introduction</u>: This third Sunday of Advent again gives us the ministry of John the Baptist. Today we hear St. John's Gospel and how he portrays the mission of the Baptist.

Lighting of Advent Candle. Let us exult for joy in the Lord.

Response: The Word was made flesh and dwelt among us.

1st **Reading:** Isaiah 61:1-2; 10-11

We hear the well known text of Isaiah that portrays the fulfilment of God's promise when the spirit of the Lord has anointed the Messiah, the Chosen One.

2nd Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24

We hear the encouragement of St. Paul to rejoice in the Lord and not to suppress the Spirit which has been given to us in baptism.

Gospel: John 1:6-8; 19-28

We hear parts of St. John's text about the mission of John the Baptist. This ministry is of the voice that cries in the wilderness.

<u>Prayer of Intercession:</u> St. Paul tells us to "pray without ceasing." In our prayers of petition, we come before God who does great things for us, and whose mercy is from age to age.

1. We pray for the Pope and the College of Bishops, that their witness for the light be also a model of "prayer without ceasing".

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

2. We pray for the Church, that its witness and living the light bring forth the fruits of the Spirit that will proclaim the kingdom of heaven amongst us.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

3. We pray for our local community, that this spirit of the season encourage us that we must decrease that Christ's grace increase in us. May many take advantage of the reconciliation in confession offered at this time.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

4. We pray for Lawrence & Victoria who will be Baptised in our parish this weekend. As you begin your faith journey, know that we are here to help and support you.

pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

5. We pray for those who are sick — especially those on our parish prayer list - and for all who care for them. For the faithful departed: those who have died recently, especially *John Ewels* and for those whose anniversaries occur at this time, especially *Desmond Dunne*, *Jim Bodswoth*, *Julia Chicarelli*, *E.K. Danister*, *John de Lai and Norrie Gardiner*, that the promise of life beyond life and life in death will be the reward of their good and faithful (pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

Celebrant: Lord, as we rejoice in your goodness, receive our prayers for the poor, the broken-hearted and all who continue to place their trust in your Holy name. We ask this through Christ the Lord. *Amen*.

Gospel

John1:6-8.19-28

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

There stands among you, unknown to you, the one who is coming after me.

A man came, sent by God.

His name was John.

He came as a witness.

as a witness to speak for the light,

so that everyone might believe through him.

He was not the light,

only a witness to speak for the light.

This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked, 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not,' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied: a voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord.' Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you – unknown to you – the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.
