REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

St Luke's account of the Annunciation draws on the Jewish tradition describing creation: 'There was darkness over the deep and God's Spirit hovered over the water. God said: "Let there be light", and there was light.' (Genesis 1:2-3) St Luke depicts Mary hearing in the depths of her soul: 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow.'

The Holy Spirit hovers over this young Jewish woman so that the most stupendously creative act in human history can take place. With her consent, God assumes human nature to be gradually enfleshed, embodied, in Mary's womb.

A naturally bewildered young woman was able to respond to God's will because she understood the imagery and the symbolism of the Genesis Story. We, in turn, need to read the Gospels in all their Jewishness so that we can understand when God's Holy Spirit hovers over our lives, asking us to fulfil some particular role in the Divine Plan. We could pause for a moment to ask whether now is the time for a Marian response: 'Be it done unto me according to your word.'

Brigid's Parish – Fourth Sunday of Advent (Year B)

24th December 2023

<u>Introduction</u>: This Fourth Sunday of Advent wants us to turn our attention towards Christmas, so we listen again to one of the Gospel Stories of the Annunciation to Mary.

Lighting of the Advent Candle.

Rejoice highly favoured, The Lord is with you.

Response: **Be it done to me according to your word.**

1st **Reading**: 2 Samuel 7:1-5,8-16

Through the prophet Nathan God makes it clear that in due course a Temple would be built to house the Ark of the Covenant, and that David's lineage would lead to the birth of the Saviour.

2nd Reading: Romans 16:25-27

St. Paul tells of the good news he preaches, that is the revelation of God's Mystery, now to be revealed everywhere to bring all to faith.

Gospel: Luke 1:26-38

In this account of the Annunciation of the Angel Gabriel to Mary of Nazareth, we read of her anxiety when told that she is to be the Mother of the Lord.

<u>Prayer of Intercession</u>: "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God," says the angel Gabriel. May, we too, share in God's goodness as we place our petitions before Him.

1. We pray for the Pope and the Bishops, that their Christmas messages will encourage people of good will to follow Mary's example and accept the plan of God.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

We pray for the Church, that devotion to the Virgin Mary will lead all Christians to Christ through her.

2. We pray for our local community, that in their final preparations for Christmas, they may put themselves into the spirit of the season to show God's Spirit of openness to all.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

3. We think of those who are suffering this Christmas through homelessness, violence, illness, loneliness, poverty, war or natural disaster. We pray that through the help, concern and generosity of others, they may be helped out of their difficulties and experience less troubled times in the New Year.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

4. At this time of joy and celebration we think of those in our community who have lost loved ones in the last year. May they find comfort in the goodness of the Father who sent his only Beloved Son onto this earth to show his love for us and to earn us redemption.

(**pause**) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

5. We pray for those who are sick – especially those on our parish prayer list - and for all who care for them. For the faithful departed: those who have died recently and for those whose anniversaries occur at this time, especially *Mick Seric*, *Ronald Chinnia*, *Joseph Consiglio*, *David Consiglio* & *Darren Nisbett*. May their family and friends be comforted in the knowledge that they now share in the banquet of heaven promised to them.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Celebrant: Confident in your covenant with us, O God, we offer our prayers, for you are truly our Lord and Saviour.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Nativity of the Lord (Christmas) Midnight

25 December

First Reading

Isaiah 9:1-7

A reading from the prophet Isaiah.

A son is given to us.

The people that walked in darkness has seen a great light; on those who live in a land of deep shadow a light has shone. You have made their gladness greater, you have made their joy increase; they rejoice in your presence as men rejoice at harvest time, as men are happy when they are dividing the spoils. For the yoke that was weighing on him, the bar across his shoulders, the rod of his oppressor, these you break as on the day of Midian. For all the footgear of battle, every cloak rolled in blood, is burnt and consumed by fire. For there is a child born for us, a son given to us and dominion is laid on his shoulders; and this is the name they give him: Wonder-Counsellor, Mighty-God, Eternal-Father, Prince-of-Peace. Wide is his dominion in a peace that has no end, for the throne of David and for his royal power, which he establishes and makes secure in justice and integrity. From this time onwards and for ever, the jealous love of the Lord of hosts will do this.

Gospel Luke 2:1-14

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

Today a saviour has been born for you.

Caesar Augustus issued a decree for a census of the whole world to be taken. This census – the first – took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria, and everyone went to his own town to be registered. So Joseph set out from the town of Nazareth in Galilee and travelled up to Judaea. to the town of David called Bethlehem, since he was of David's House and line, in order to be registered together with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. While they were there the time came for her to have her child, and she gave birth to a son, her first-born. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger because there was no room for them at the inn. In the countryside close by there were shepherds who lived in the fields and took it in turns to watch their flocks during the night. The angel of the Lord appeared to them and the glory of the Lord shone round them. They were terrified, but the angel said, 'Do not be afraid. Listen, I bring you news of great joy, a joy to be shared by the whole people. Today in the town of David a saviour has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord. And here is a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger.' And suddenly with the angel there was a great throng of the heavenly host, praising God and singing:

'Glory to God in the highest heaven and peace to men who enjoy his favour.'
