REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

How does God picture us? St Paul reveals one of God's favourite ways of regarding us.

'We are God's work of art, created in Christ Jesus, to live the good life as from the beginning He had intended us to live it.'

Just as an artist respects the medium he or she is working in, whether it be oils or crayon, so too God respects us as human beings with free will. Which is why His works of art don't always look the way He intended!

Now, if one has a work of art in the house, a picture or print that means a lot to you, or perhaps the first sketch by a child, do you put it in the darkest corner of the room? Or do you allow just enough light to fall on it so as to reveal how terrific it is, why it gives you pleasure? Of course, the latter.

Now, if you and I are God's work of art, God wants exactly the same. He wants us to be revealed in the light. What sort of light? Christ our Light.

Of course, it might be necessary for the Light to dispel some darkness, some shadow dimension of our lives. In this regard Christ is a healing Light, but this is so that he might illuminate us in a way which more clearly reveals the love which the Divine Artist has for His creation.

We might take a moment to pray for the courage to expose ourselves to Christ's healing light this Lent to be more beautifully illuminated at Easter.

St. Brigid's Parish – Fourth Sunday of Lent (Year B)

10th March 2024

<u>Introduction</u>: In the middle stage of the Lenten Season we are asked to rejoice. We are reminded that God loves us so much that the Son was sent to us, not to condemn either us or our world but so that we might all be saved.

1st Reading: 2 Chronicles 36:14-23

The time of Exile is a time of purification, a time that ends with the building of the Temple. The people of God are challenged to live out God's plan.

2nd Reading: Ephesians 2:4-10

We hear Paul's powerful words that God's love saved us even when we were sinners. We are saved by faith in God and not so much by what we do ourselves.

Gospel: John 3:14-21

The dialogue between Nicodemus and Jesus is a reflection on how God's plan for our salvation is revealed in Jesus; he gives his life for us.

<u>Prayers of Intercession:</u> God, who is rich in mercy, has brought us to new life with Christ. Let us lift up our hearts in prayer to Him today.

1. We pray for the world's leaders and our Church leaders that their dialogue with the nations and peoples of the world may be carried out in a spirit of openness to all and not to the exclusion of the weak.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

2. We pray that the gift of reconciliation achieved in Christ Jesus may continue to encourage us to deepen our Lenten resolve to live by Gospel values.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

3. That we in this community, already forgiven by God, will shine forth as witnesses to God's abundant mercy.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

4. We pray for all who suffer any form of disability. May they also be aware of the gifts that they bring to life in themselves and others.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

5. We pray for ourselves and the needs of all in our parish community. We pray for those who are sick – especially those on our parish prayer list - and for all who care for them. For the faithful departed: for those who have died recently especially *David Arnel & Fr. Kevin Bates* and for those whose anniversaries occur at this time, especially *Taryn Cawley*, may they open their hearts to the one who opens for them the gates of eternal life.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

<u>Celebrant</u>: Father, we thank you for all the gifts you have given us and ask you to help us use them wisely and for your glory. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

The Living Word

Fourth Sunday of Lent, Year B

10 March 2024

First Reading

2 Chronicles 36:14-16. 19-23

A reading from the second book of Chronicles.

The wrath and the mercy of the Lord are revealed in the exile and liberation of his people.

All the heads of the priesthood, and the people too, added infidelity to infidelity, copying all the shameful practices of the nations and defiling the Temple that the Lord had consecrated for himself in Jerusalem. The Lord, the God of their ancestors, tirelessly sent them messenger after messenger, since he wished to spare his people and his house. But they ridiculed the messengers of God, they despised his words, they laughed at his prophets, until at last the wrath of the Lord rose so high against his people that there was no further remedy. Their enemies burned down the Temple of God, demolished the walls of Jerusalem, set fire to all its palaces, and destroyed everything of value in it. The survivors were deported by Nebuchadnezzar to Babylon; they were to serve him and his sons until the kingdom of Persia came to power. This is how the word of the Lord was fulfilled that he spoke: through Jeremiah, 'Until this land has enjoyed its Sabbath rest, until seventy years have gone by, it will keep Sabbath throughout the days of its desolation.' And in the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, to fulfil the word of the Lord that was spoken through Jeremiah, the Lord roused the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia to issue a proclamation and to have it publicly displayed throughout his kingdom: 'Thus speaks Cyrus king of Persia, "The Lord, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth; he has ordered me to build him a Temple in Jerusalem, in Judah. Whoever there is among you of all his people, may his God be with him! Let him go up."

Second Reading

Ephesians 2:4-10

\boldsymbol{A} reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Ephesians.

When we were dead through sins, he brought us to life. God loved us with so much love that he was generous with his mercy: when we were dead through our sins, he brought us to life with Christ - it is through grace that you have been saved - and raised us up with him and gave us a place with him in heaven, in Christ Jesus.

This was to show for all ages to come, through his goodness towards us in Christ Jesus, how infinitely rich he is in grace. Because it is by grace that you have been saved, through faith; not by anything of your own, but by a gift from God; not by anything that you have done, so that nobody can claim the credit. We are God's work of art, created in Christ Jesus to live the good life as from the beginning he had meant us to live it.

Gospel

John 3:14-21

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

God sent his Son into the world that we might be saved through him.

Jesus said to Nicodemus:

'The Son of Man must be lifted up as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him.

Yes, God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life. For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved. No one who believes in him will be condemned; but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already, because he has refused to believe in the name of God's only Son.

On these grounds is sentence pronounced: that though the light has come into the world men have shown they prefer darkness to the light because their deeds were evil. And indeed, everybody who does wrong hates the light and avoids it, for fear his actions should be exposed; but the man who lives by the truth comes out into the light, so that it may be plainly seen that what he does is done in God.
