REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

Our Risen Lord could have appeared to groups of followers generation after generation until now. But he withdrew his visible bodily presence from us.

Why? I think because he needed to wean human beings from our tendency to be self-centred. The Resurrection starts the transformation of the whole of creation, not just us. Ordinary human beings are the heart and mind and voice of non-angelic creation.

We love and understand and speak on its behalf. The transforming effect of Our Lord's glorified humanity is much more profound. Every molecule, every quantum of energy, the past, present and future are all in the process of being changed towards 'the fullness of him who fills the whole creation'. At every Mass, this divine resurrection power is at work. Elements of the universe, wheat-bread, grapes-wine, become the Real Presence of Our Lord's glorified body.

The privilege of a ministerial priest is to be the ritual servant of this divine transformation. Invoking the Holy Spirit and reciting the words of the Last Supper is the priest's role in Our Lord's creative real anticipation of the end of time.

We could take a moment to pray for the grace to let go of our self-centredness, to stop staring into the empty sky as though lamenting Our Lord's absence, and to savour the privilege of receiving his Real Presence in the transformed elements of creation as we and they share in that Holy Communion which is the destiny of the whole cosmos. <u>mtate@bigpond.com</u>

<u>St. Brigid's Parish</u> – The Ascension of The Lord (Year B)

Introduction: The purpose of this feast is to emphasise that the Ascension of Jesus is central to Christian belief and practice. The death, resurrection, ascension and sending of the Holy Spirit are all facets of the Paschal Mystery.

1st Reading: Acts 1:1-11

We hear the beginning of Luke's second book as he continues after the death of Jesus to reflect on the mission of the Church.

2nd Reading: Ephesians 1:17-23

Paul recalls God's action in the past to encourage his listeners that the God whose strength was the power at work in Christ is the same God who now makes Jesus the head of the Church.

Gospel: Mark 16:15-20

Mark concludes his Gospel with an overview of the mission of the eleven and how they went everywhere preaching the Word and the presence of the Spirit.

We strive to preserve the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. Our prayers **Prayer of Intercession:** today come from that unity of one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all.

In this week of Prayer for Christian Unity we pray that all Christians strive to respond to Christ's desire for 1. unity and that all be consecrated in the truth. Lord hear our prayer.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

We pray that we may come to appreciate the reason for Christ's ascension and return to the Father's right 2. hand so that their Spirit be sent among us to continue the Trinitarian plan for the world. (pause) We pray to the Lord. Lord hear our prayer.

We pray for our world, especially for those nations struggling against injustice and violence. May they 3. experience peace in our time.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Lord hear our prayer.

We pray for our mothers and mothers everywhere. May we look back in gratitude and go forward in faith 4. to strengthen the loving bonds between the generations. Lord hear our prayer.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

We pray for ourselves and the needs of all in our parish community. We pray for those who are sick – 5. especially those on our parish prayer list – and for all who care for them that we too commit ourselves to nurture and encourage those around us. For the faithful departed: for those who have died recently, and for those whose anniversaries occur at this time, especially Patricia Shelly & Victor Bissett; that in the eternal life of God's promise they find eternal peace.

(pause) We pray to the Lord.

Please join in the Parish Prayer.

Celebrant: God of Infinite Mercy, graciously look upon us today as we offer these prayers to you. Hear us, in the name of Christ Jesus whose return to you we celebrate with great joy this day. Amen.

The Ascension of the Lord, Year B

12 May 2024

First Reading

Acts 1:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Why are you standing here looking into the sky?

Jesus has been taken into heaven. In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

Ephesians 1:17-23

A reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Ephesians.

He made Jesus to sit at his right hand in heaven. May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a spirit of wisdom and perception of what is revealed, to bring you to full knowledge of him. May he enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit and how infinitely great is the power that he has exercised for us believers. This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark.

The Lord Jesus was taken into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God.

Jesus showed himself to the Eleven and said to them, 'Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News to all creation. He who believes and is baptised is saved; he who does not believe will be condemned. These are the signs that will be associated with believers: in my name they will cast out devils; they will have the gift of tongues; they will pick up snakes in their hands, and be unharmed should they drink deadly poison; they will lay their hands on the sick, who will recover.'

And so the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven: there at the right hand of God he took his place, while they, going out, preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word by the signs that accompanied it.
