#### **REFLECTION** by Fr Michael Tate

I have met the Dalai Lama, obviously an admirable man of deep spirituality and simplicity of life. He believes that, after his death, there could be a further phase of existence as an insect or an animal.

Contrast Jesus of Nazareth, a man of deep spirituality and simplicity of life. He believed, and staked his life on it, that he would lead a glorified, fully human existence after death. There would be no extinguishing of his personality, but rather, it would be enhanced. He was vindicated in the Resurrection.

As St John Paul II put it, at the Last Supper, Our Lord gave us a sacramental way of eating and drinking and 'digest[ing] the secret of the Resurrection', what St Ignatius of Antioch called, 'the medicine of immortality, an antidote to death'.

Our Lord chose bread and wine to convey his Real Presence into us. It is the first course of the marriage feast of Heaven, but it has a beneficial effect on our earthly stage of existence. Bread nourishes us and wine gladdens our hearts.

Our Lord shares his risen and glorified life with us because he wants to nourish us and gladden our hearts. We may take a moment to pray that we will share the marriage feast of Heaven with those we especially love, and those for whom heavenly existence will be a life-enhancing surprise. Let us pray for His Holiness the Dalai Lama that he may find himself alongside Pope Francis in the everlasting joy of Heaven.

National Volunteer Week is Australia's largest annual celebration of volunteering and will be held on 20-26 May 2024.



<u>Introduction</u>: The Feast of the Trinity flows from the baptismal theme so strong in Easter. Baptised in the name of the Trinity, we share the grace of our Lord, Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit.

#### **1st Reading:** Deuteronomy 4:32-34, 39-40

We hear the words of Moses as he interprets for the people their relationship with God which Christian revelation takes even further.

#### **2<sup>nd</sup> Reading:** Romans: 8:14-17

With these words Paul reassures us that through our baptism we share the very life of God, and it is as children of God that we can pray.

#### **Gospel:** Matthew 28:16-20

With these final words of Jesus he commissions the disciples to go out to the whole world and baptise in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

<u>Prayer of Intercession</u>: God, in Christ, has promised to be with us always. With such trust, we gather together our prayers in this assembly and place them before our loving God.

For the faithful departed: for those who have died recently, especially Dr. Frank Power and for those whose anniversaries occur at this time, especially *Margaret Fletcher*; that moved by the Spirit of God they will be coheirs with Christ and raised up through his glory. 
Matthew 28:16-20

# First Meeting St Brigid's Church 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Working Party

150 years ago, construction of a very significant building in Gisborne, St Brigid's Catholic Church, was completed. We owe so much to the past parishioners and priests who brought the faith to this district and grew it and sustained it, and it's important that we recognise with gratitude this 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our church and what it offers us today.

Father Vincent asked for volunteers to form a Working Party to start planning for this special event for our faith community of St Brigid's Parish. A faith community that encompasses three places of worship, St Brigid's, St Patrick's and St Ambrose and two Catholic Primary Schools, St Brigid's and Holy Cross as well as a number of pastoral groups that support wellbeing and care of those in need.

The Working Party is made up of Fr Vincent, Jenne Wallace, Eddie Gardiner, Joanne & Craig Holmes, Bernie Floreani, Paul Lawry, Gerard Carroll, Joe Farrugia and Trish Armstrong. Each person shared their name, involvement in the parish and aspirations for wanting to be a part of planning for this special and significant event.

As we talked, the common goal of promoting and building a sense of belonging and ownership across our parish became very evident as well as promoting ongoing awareness and knowledge about our parish in its past, present and into the future. What also became very evident as we talked, was the importance of broadening the support base for our Parish Faith community and that this important event would give us an opportunity to open up to members of our Parish to share their gifts and talents.

Our next meeting will be held on Tuesday, June 25<sup>th</sup>. This gives us time to investigate some of the directions/actions we listed through our discussions: confirmation of historical dates, some possible events or installations that would befit the occasion [eg: Installation of the gate which is the only remaining part of St Colmcille/St Columbus gathering place at Bullengarook], meeting with the principals of St Brigid's and Holy Cross, meet with members of Bacchus Marsh church anniversary committee to learn from them and most importantly, to hear from members of our parish who have ideas to offer that will add to making this a special event for all members of our parish faith community.

We ask all members of our Parish Faith Community to take time to think about possible ways that we could mark this very special occasion. Maybe something you have experienced or seen in another place and time or it may be linked to your skill set and could ensure that the success of the day is guaranteed by what you can offer.
