REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

Every element of the universe, even the most destructive, is listening for the voice of Our Lord, "Quiet, be still." In this Gospel story, the waters of chaos respond to the voice of the Lord of all creation, allowing Jesus to accompany his disciples to the other side of the Sea of Galilee.

We all know of times when chaos storms into our life, when we feel we are being swamped whether from outside or from some part of our own personality. Some part of our life is facing death. We may cry out to Jesus "Don't you care?".

He will come to accompany us but always to "the other side". Our Lord does not indulge the fantasy of "turning back the clock". We have to keep rowing in a new direction. There is no nostalgic return to the old situation. We may well feel displaced, disoriented, but Our Lord is our companion in the unfamiliar situation we have reached.

We could take a moment to pray for Our Lord to help us in all life-threatening situations, especially in the final transit through the wrenching chaos of death. May we hear him rebuke the Prince of Darkness and Death: "Quiet, be still" as he accompanies us to the other side, to the promised land of Heaven. mtate@bigpond.com

St. Brigid's Parish – 12th Sunday of Ordinary Time (Year B)

Introduction: In today's Mass we are reminded that the Lord is master of all creation, even the raging sea. For us that is a cause not of fear but of reassurance.

1st Reading: Job 3:1, 8-11

The Lord asks Job what power he has that would enable him to master the "proud waves".

2nd Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:14-17

Paul speaks of being "overwhelmed" by the love of Christ who through his death and resurrection has made of us "a new creation".

Gospel: Mark 4:35-41

By quelling the fierce storm, Jesus shows that he shares in God's creative power; and more than that, he makes of us "a new creation".

Prayer of Intercession: We turn now in confidence to our Father who is able to overcome all the evils that threaten us.

1. Lord, when the Church seems threatened by storms of scandal or persecution or harassment of any kind, help us to trust that you will come to our help.

5. We pray for ourselves and the needs of all in our parish community. We pray for those who are sick – especially those on our parish prayer list – and for all who care for them. For the faithful departed: for those who have died recently, and for those whose anniversaries occur at this time, especially *Charles Sexton*, that they may experience their reward of their faith on earth, because the Eucharist has brought them to the fullness of life.

First Reading

Job 38:1, 8-11

A reading from the book of Job.

Here I have set the boundaries of the sea.

From the heart of the tempest the Lord gave Job his answer. He said:

Who pent up the sea behind closed doors when it leapt tumultuous out of the womb, when I wrapped it in a robe of mist and made black clouds its swaddling bands; when I marked the bounds it was not to cross and made it fast with a bolted gate? Come thus far, I said, and no farther: here your proud waves shall break.

Second Reading

2 Corinthians 5:14-17

A reading from the second letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians.

All things are made new.

The love of Christ overwhelms us when we reflect that if one man has died for all, then all men should be dead; and the reason he died for all was so that living men should live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised to life for them.

From now onwards, therefore, we do not judge anyone by the standards of the flesh. Even if we did once know Christ in the flesh, that is not how we know him now. And for anyone who is in Christ, there is a new creation; the old creation has gone, and now the new one is here.

Gospel Mark 4:35-41

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark.

Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him. With the coming of evening, Jesus said to his disciples, 'Let us cross over to the other side.' And leaving the crowd behind they took him, just as he was, in the boat; and there were other boats with him. Then it began to blow a gale and the waves were breaking into the boat so that it was almost swamped. But he was in the stern, his head on the cushion, asleep. They woke him and said to him, 'Master, do you not care? We are going down!' And he woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Quiet now! Be calm!' And the wind dropped, and all was calm again. Then he said to them, 'Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?' They were filled with awe and said to one another, 'Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.'
