LITURGY NOTES—The Word of God At Mass we listen to the Word of God and reflect on its message. God's Word is active. It is both a word to be heard and a guide to way we live. We are called to take the Word of God with us in our hearts when we leave the church and return to our everyday lives. As a reminder of this call, at the end of Mass the lectionary, open at the Gospel reading of the day, will be placed on the front of the ambo facing the congregation. The Word of God will leave the church in the hearts of the people rather than a closed book.

<u>INITIATIVES INVOLVING CHILDREN AT MASS</u>—One of the actions to arise from responses given in the Parish Survey and other conversations, either from parents of young children wanting a connection to Mass but not quite getting there, or from others who miss the presence of young families at Mass, is to provide a special ministry for young families. If you are interested in assisting, please contact the Parish Office. One initiative we will start with is to create a special place for children in our music ministry.

Music: At first we will trial this initiative twice a month; once at 6.30pm Mass on a Saturday and once at 10.00am Mass on a Sunday. Children will be asked to come over near the choir and musician's area and to take one of the musical instruments provided in the box and help make the final hymn as joyful as possible, by joining in the music. The date for the month of August is **Sunday 12th of August at 10.00am**. Children's Liturgy of the Word we have tried earlier to introduce Children's Liturgy of the Word, but for some reason it didn't continue. We would love to provide this experience for children. It involves the children going into another room, just before the readings, with leaders who would explore what the readings are in a way that children understand, using activities and other various means. The children then return to the parents in the church after the Liturgy of the Word. We would really like to introduce this ministry again, but we need adults who would be interested in helping us. Mary Ryan from the Archdiocese is very happy to come out and help us get set up and to provide training. I am hoping we could introduce Children's Liturgy of the Word at the same Masses in which we have the children's music and that we have enough volunteers to have a roster so that maybe you would only be needed once a month – or more if you would like. ## First Reading Ex 16:2-4, 12-15

I will rain bread from heaven upon you.

The whole community of the sons of Israel began to complain against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness and said to them, 'Why did we not die at the Lord's hand in the land of Egypt, when we were able to sit down to pans of meat and could eat bread to our hearts content! As it is, you have brought us to this wilderness to starve this whole company to death!'

Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Now I will rain down bread for you from the heavens. Each day the people are to go out and gather the day's portion: I propose to test them this way to see whether they will follow my law

'I have heard the complaints of the sons of Israel. Say this to them, "Between the two evenings you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have bread to your hearts content. Then you will learn that I, the Lord, am your God." And so it came about: quails flew up in the evening, and they covered the camp; in the morning there was a coating of dew all round the camp. When the coating of dew lifted, there on the surface of the desert was a thing delicate, powdery, as fine as hoarfrost on the ground. When they saw this, the sons of Israel said to one another, 'What is that?' not knowing what it was. 'That' said Moses to them 'is the bread the Lord gives you to eat.'

### **Responsorial Psalm**

(R.) The Lord gave them bread from heaven.

Put on the new person that has been created in God's image.

I want to urge you in the name of the Lord, not to go on living the aimless kind of life that pagans live. Now that is hardly the way you have learnt from Christ, unless you failed to hear him properly when you were

taught what the truth is in Jesus. You must give up your old way of life; you must put aside your old self, which gets corrupted by following illusory desires. Your mind must be renewed by a spiritual revolution so that you can put on the new self that has been created in God's way, in the goodness and holiness of the truth.

Alleluia, alleluia! No one lives on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.

### Gospel Jn 6:24-35

Whoever comes to me will never be hungry; whoever believes in me will never thirst.

When the people saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they got into boats and crossed to Capernaum to look for Jesus. When they found him on the other side, they said to him, 'Rabbi, when did you come here?' Jesus answered:

'I tell you most solemnly, you are not looking for me because you have seen the signs but because you had all the bread you wanted to eat.

Do not work for food that cannot last, but work for food that endures to eternal

the kind of food the Son of Man is offering you,

for on him the Father, God himself, has set his seal.'

Then they said to him, 'What must we do if we are to do the works that God wants?' Jesus gave them this answer, 'This is working for God: you must believe in the one he has sent.' So they said, 'What sign will you give to show us that we should believe in you? What work will you do? Our fathers had manna to eat in the desert; as scripture says: He gave them bread from heaven to eat.'

Jesus answered:

- 'I tell you most solemnly,
- it was not Moses who gave you bread from heaven.
- it is my Father who gives you the bread from heaven,

the true bread;

for the bread of God

is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.'

'Sir,' they said 'give us that bread always.' Jesus answered:

'I am the bread of life.

He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never thirst.



### Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

Some religions, and even strands of Catholicism, try to suppress appetites in order to achieve some 'out-of-thisworld' liberation. But appetites are good things, telling us what we humans need as bodily, social, spiritual beings. They provide a reality check against our tendency to think that salvation is exclusively about the soul.

Our appetites for food and drink, for affection and companionship, for the truth about the Big Picture of our life journey, need to be satisfied or we disintegrate in various ways.

Our Lord Jesus Christ proclaims in today's Gospel that He is the total satisfaction of our deepest human appetites: 'I am the Bread from Heaven which gives life to the world.'

That 'Life' is nothing less than participation in Divine Life, existing in the Big Picture in the way God intended. That is the nourishment offered not to a particular tribe or ethnic group, but to the whole of humanity, indeed to the whole of creation.

We could take a moment to pray for faith to recognise that the bread brought up at the Offertory is truly transformed: no longer short term food like manna in the desert, but 'the Bread of Life', the Real Presence of the One who nourishes our humanity, indeed who gives Life to the world.
