Gospel Reflection

<u>Prayer</u>

In the midst of an extremely hectic
24 hours where Jesus effectively launches
his public ministry, Jesus takes time to go
aside to a lonely place and pray. The
passage tells us that it was 'long before
dawn' that he did this. It may have been his
usual practice to pray early in the morning
or he may have been restless after the events
of the previous day and the thought of
what lay ahead.

Nevertheless, Jesus provides us with a model of using prayer to reflect on events and to prepare ourselves for the day ahead.



THANKS TO ALL WHO RESPONDED TO THE PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL SURVEY whether hearing about it through the parish news sheet or though the "Skoolbag" app and responding online or through submitting a hand written sheet.

There have been 80 responses with around two thirds of these female. A good number (30%) were aged less 60 and 1 in 5 had children attending St Mary's school. Over 80% of respondents attend Mass weekly and 60% strongly thought that St Marys was important to them. Already our parish has been positively affected by the thinking of parishioners who have engaged with the survey questions about the issues facing our parish and the word cloud gives a small picture of the survey response.

With almost 30 000 words of your feedback to read, the Parish Pastoral Council has many hours of work ahead in listening to the responses from the parish community and discerning issues needing to be addressed. This important phase will take time and care but there is the prospect of much that will helpful for our parish.


TRAFFICKING - Pope Francis set **February 8** as a day of prayer, reflection and action to end human trafficking and slavery. St Josephine Bakhita, patron saint for victims of slavery, was born in West Sudan in 1869. As a young girl, she was kidnapped for slavery in Sudan and Italy. A 2016 United Nations report uncovered more than 500 different human trafficking routes across many parts of the world. It is estimated that millions of women, girls, men and boys are trafficked annually into domestic servitude, sexual exploitation, pornography, forced marriage and forced labour. Almost 80 per cent of trafficking victims are women and girls. It is also happening here in Australia.

Australian Catholic Bishops 2017-18 Social Justice Statement has the theme Everyone's Business Developing an inclusive and sustainable economy. The following is the third of ten steps suggested from the statement that we can take towards an Inclusive, Sustainable Economy. Step 3. IDENTIFY THOSE WHO EXPERIENCE EXCLUSION

Consider the key areas of economic exclusion in your neighbourhood. It may be issues like homelessness, environmental degradation, youth unemployment or cuts to Sunday penalty rates.
