Shepherds in first century Palestine were far from the idyllic Pastoral image that we generally associate with the image. 6 April 1918 an American Catholic soldier at the Front, in a letter to his mother, relates what he calls "the story of the war". He says he heard it from a Protestant chaplain: "Somewhere in France there is a little church without a curé. Across its door hangs the red ribbon of the Legion of Honour, bestowed upon the church because its pastor cannot receive it; and unanimously voted to that church by freethinkers and atheists. A young priest, serving as a private, was in a dug-out at the Front, with a band of soldiers. A bomb, falling near the entrance, exploded, sending its fragments inside and mortally wounding every one of them. That priest, with both legs shattered, made his way about the smoke-filled cave and administered the last rites of the Church to every man in there before he himself died - just as the stretcher-bearers came to drag the victims out."

The covenant of love lived by the Holy Family of Nazareth illuminates the principle which gives shape to every family, and enables it better to face the trials of life. On this basis, every family despite it weaknesses can become a light for the world.

This is the only name by which we can be saved.

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Peter said: 'Rulers of the people, and elders! The Father loves me. because I lay down my life


in order to take it up again.

Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

In the regions where Jesus was an itinerant preacher, three or four flocks could be kept in a communal sheepfold for safety. In the morning, the shepherds would come and, as each called out, the sheep attuned to the sound of his voice would follow to life-giving pasture.

We are surrounded by hundreds of voices clamouring for our attention. We are bombarded by messages, social media incessantly chattering. Jesus invites us to get attuned to his voice, listening for the distinctive sound of it so that, even if it is faintly heard in a cacophony, we immediately turn toward it so that we can follow it in a life-giving direction.

How do we get attuned to that voice? By reading the gospels. A Chinese student once told me that the Chinese character for gospel is 'happy sounds'. I like the plural. Jesus' gospel voice is not a monotone but a polyphony sounding in different ways in different situations.

As disciples, we have to get onto the same wavelength as that voice so that we can echo it in our own lives. We become reverberations of Christ's voice in many different situations, helping him to lead others to lifegiving pastures.

We could take a moment to pray for better listening so that we might recognise the gospel voice of Jesus Christ, especially at the moment of death. Then we may hear the one voice we need and long for: 'Today you will be with me in paradise.'
