THANK YOU for your Sacrificial Giving contribution over the last financial year and for your support over the years, without which the work of the parish could not be maintained. In the past, many receipts have not been collected or are not required, so in our continued endeavours to save paper, a printed tax receipt will be supplied upon request. Soft copies are also available. As from last Financial Year there is no tax deductibility as there is no contribution to the School Building Fund. The Parish Finance Committee decided this as the school has become less dependent on Parish contribution and the Parish is dependent entirely on the contribution of Parishioners. At the same time, Parish School parents were asked to contribute \$120 per annum per family if not currently contributing to the Parish Support Program. SIGNIFICANT INCREASE IN ST VINCENT DE PAUL WINTER APPEAL. Thank you to all parishioners at St Mary's and St Thomas' for a very successful Vinnies Winter Appeal of 2018. The total sum donated from the two churches was \$10,256 as cash donations, which is \$1,500 more than the Winter appeal of 2017. Items of food, blankets and clothing were also donated, to help people make it through the winter. Our two primary schools collected a total of 45 laundry baskets of nutritious long life foods to be distributed as food parcels to the people we assist. ### Reflection by Dianne Bergant CSA

God chooses ordinary people and confers on them an extraordinary responsibility. Amos was a shepherd and a dresser of sycamores. Most of the apostles were fishermen. Paul was a tentmaker. Christians today are mechanics and clerks, teachers and engineers, doctors and housekeepers. These are all people following ordinary trades or professions, but what they do in them is truly remarkable. They touch minds and hearts and souls, and they heal them. They instruct and comfort people, and they help to drive out the demons that possess them. They participate in very ordinary ways in the extraordinary establishment of the reign of God.

Jesus inaugurated the reign of God on earth. He chose disciples and sent them out to continue the work that he had begun, to preach his gospel and, through healings and exorcisms, to conquer the forces of evil that threatened that reign. And now we have been called; in him we have been chosen, in all of our brokenness and vulnerability. The task to which we have been called is awe-inspiring; and every spiritual blessing in the heavens has been bestowed upon us so that we will be able to accomplish it. If we allow Christ's saving power to take possession of us, we too will further his prophetic ministry. We will bring the saving grace of God to the world that is terrified and that writhes in pain; we will bring it to those places where healing is needed and where demons still hold sway. We will bring all things under the headship of Christ.
