THE ROYAL COMMISSION Dear Parishioners with the delivery this week of the final report to the Federal Government from the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse, we move as a Church to the next stage of the painful process of atoning for the sins of the past. <u>PARKING</u> You will have noticed extensive work done in Church and school grounds, to improve traffic flow and parking. This provides better traffic flow and safety for pedestrians. It has been noted however, that while there are several disabled parking positions, there are some members of our community who on a temporary or permanent basis, do not qualify for a disabled permit but still have difficulty walking the distance from some of the car parks, across our undulating terrain, to the Church. These include elderly, families with very young children and those recovering from accidents, illness or medical procedures. With this in mind we ask that at Mass times, the 12 parking spaces closest to the Church, be left free for them to use. We would like to remind anyone who is using these parking spaces that you may find it easier to enter the Church by the side door on the Presbytery side.
