
Parish Pastoral Council Survey Feedback Phase (2018) Feedback Topic 4: Q6. Overall, St Mary's Parish is going well.

#17 Faith development is families, parish and school. Our children are more rounded because of the people the have met through the parish and they get a better sense of community

#28 We visited two other parishes before we settled on St Marys Greensborough. The parishioners are friendly and there appear to be many activities going on and Steven Rigo's homilies are well worth listening to. However with his additional duties now, that 'attraction' is fading away. I hope others can fill that gap, though currently it is not promising

#29 Having been with St Mary's since about 1974, the parish is part of my life.

#33 St Marys has been my parish for many years and I would prefer it to remain so.

#37 I grew up in the Catholic Religion, I pray at least once a day; I believe this gives me comfort, keeps me strong and resilient and mindful - it has helped me to stay sane. (Though without a bit of insight into some Buddhist beliefs through yoga ie forgiving oneself, relaxation techniques, awareness of ego etc, I may not have stayed sane - the catholic beliefs of old were also very narrow

minded and brain washing and didn't help my self esteem, possibly made me a more anxious person.) Praying together in a community is important to me; my children went to Sunday School at St Mary's; I believed that was the most important part of their education. 2 of my children chose to continue on with the faith, however they haven't been in recent years, apart from Christmas, they haven't told me but I suspect it's because of the child abuse issues. I was educated by a beautiful order of Nuns, and really appreciate their teaching, and that I didn't grow up to be spiritually deprived.

#6 "Unsure" because it is important to some but obviously of little importance to others (based on Mass attendance and involvement in the Parish).

#10 I would normally say agree, but I am struggling with the institution of the church. #16 Having been within the Parish for 5 years, I feel more a part of the school community than the Parish. I'm not sure I would use either Priest as my religious counsel as I don't feel that they would be able to have insight into my situation. I don't feel very connected with the Church as a woman; I do feel that the issues that are important to me are not able to be addressed as the rulings of the Vatican are archaic and out of touch with modern women. The family preparation for sacraments night was so horribly wrong, as we were shown a film about how a woman would only be forgiven for an abortion if she was truly sorry. As a health care worker, the damage that this persistence of blaming a woman and not taking into account any circumstances, or placing any responsibility on the father, can do to the psyche of a person can have lifelong effects, and sometimes cause generational trauma. I had to work through alot of anger after that evening, and had many hours of soul searching as to whether I wanted my children to receive sacraments within the Catholic Church. I'm honestly not sure whether I will attend another faith night.
