Media Statement – Archbishop Denis Hart Legal Identity of Defendants (Organisational Child Abuse) Bill 2018

I welcome today's announcement by the Victorian Government of its intention to introduce new laws allowing victims of child abuse to sue institutions which may be responsible for their abuse.

This is a reform which I welcomed when *Betrayal of Trust* was released in 2013 and for which the Truth Justice and Healing Council on behalf of the Catholic Church has advocated in submissions to the Royal Commission. In relation to civil claims involving personnel of the Archdiocese of Melbourne, I have for the past few years nominated myself as the defendant in civil claims for child abuse and agreed to meet any liability established against a former Archbishop of Melbourne.

When the new law is passed, the Archdiocese will have an entity that satisfies its requirements available as a proper defendant to respond to any future claims that might be made.

The Archdiocese seeks to resolve claims through survivor focused redress whenever possible. I remain committed to fair, reasonable and honest dealings with victims of child abuse and to always treating
