


## **First Holy Communion**

As mentioned earlier here, we are now busy preparing for the Sacrament of First Holy Communion, for our children in the St Thomas Catechetics Program. Parents of these children would have received an email from us, outlining the information necessary for preparing your children for this beautiful sacrament. Please make it a point to go through it all with your child.







As Catholics, we know that the Holy Eucharist is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Pope Francis has called it the "Sacrament of Love". And this is so true! Jesus comes to us in a unique way in the Eucharist. When He comes, we receive Him into our body and our soul. This is so beautiful and intimate. The child preparing for this sacrament is going to be profoundly united with Jesus in a way that they never have before.

Our next meeting for the First Holy Communion group is on 9th November at 6.30 pm. The last session before the administering of the sacrament, where we will go into the church to rehearse for the day, will be on 23rd. More information regarding this will follow. Parents, please take note of these dates.

### First Year Group

Our little ones (grade 2 students) are going well with their catechism and always amaze me with the questions they ask and little examples that they share in the group. They are truly a wonderful lot, so eager to learn and experience the faith. Having Mum or dad by their side makes it so much more comfortable for them. So thank you, dear parents, for your ongoing commitment to this program. This group will be ready for their Sacrament of Reconciliation, early next year. Lisa and I hope to have the calendar ready and emailed out to as soon as possible.

Also I would like you to know that from next year, there will be a few changes. In consultation with Father Steve Rigo and the Religion Coordinator of the school, it has been decided that from 2018, the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be administered to the children, while they are in grade 2. This will make it necessary for us, at the Catechetical Program to have this Sacrament twice next year, once for this year's group (which will most likely be in March or April) and the second time, for the new group that enrolls next year. From then on, Reconciliation will always be administered in grade 2. Thus, we would then be on par with St Thomas Primary School and consequently, we would be able to share common dates with them, such as Sacramental Information Nights for parents and Commitment Masses for the children. However, we will not be joining them for the Sacrament of First Holy Communion, which we will always try to celebrate on the feast of Christ the King, in November. This has been a long standing tradition and we are not about to change it. More information on this will follow before the end of this year.

Should you need any more information or clarifications, please do not hesitate to contact us, either through email or on the number displayed on the front page of this newsletter. We are generally in, on a Thursday.

Before I end, I would like to make a brief mention of the importance of the month of November, for us Catholics. This month is dedicated to the Souls in Purgatory, whose feast is celebrated on November 2nd. All Souls Day is a holy day set aside for honoring the dead. The Church has always taught us to pray for those who have gone into eternity. So this month, let us make some time to pray for our dear departed.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

Another significant feast that we celebrate this month is the feast of Christ the King. On this Sunday, we celebrate the all-embracing authority of Christ as King and Lord of all things. It is celebrated on the final Sunday of Ordinary Time, the Sunday before Advent. This year, the feast falls on November 26th. It is on this day, that our catechism children here at St Thomas Parish, will be receiving their First Holy Communion. Let us keep them in our prayers.

Thank you, dear parents. Do enjoy this lovely month of November and all the fun and beauty of this season.
