You are warmly invited to join us for five weekly Sunday evening prayer sessions on ZOOM.



St Thomas' Parish Pastoral Council: Meeting 18th October 2023

- PPC welcomed John Bohan who provided a financial report to 30th September 2023. The report indicated a deficit, even with
 income generated from the Early Learning Centre. John warned of an increase in future expenditure due to an anticipated
 increase in the cost of insurance, a consequence of Catholic Insurance ceasing to operate.
- Stay tuned to learn how the school and parish are planning celebrations to mark the Church's 25th anniversary in 2024 and the establishment of the Parish's 40th anniversary in 2026.
- October, the month of the Rosary, was marked by the distribution of Papal blessed rosary beads given to the Year 2 students who are preparing to receive their First Reconciliation.
- Have your Christmas crib/nativity scene ready to bring for blessing at the Masses on 2nd & 3rd December.
- In order to alleviate the disappointment of those looking for a night Mass on the feast of the Assumption, there will be an
- evening Mass at St Thomas on 2nd November, the feast of All Souls.
- A suggestion for the school children to create ceramic depictions of the Stations of the Cross for permanent placement at the Church is being investigated, perhaps involving a grant for an "artist in residence" at the school in order to facilitate it.
- A Mary statue is being spruced up before taking residence in the Marian chapel.
- Mary Jahne has created a "Lament to hope" banner which will hang in the Church with a description beneath. A report was
 given on the recent Liturgy of Lament held at Sacred Heart. The organisers expressed disappointment at the poor representation of St Thomas' parishioners; however the clash of commitments can never be taken into consideration to accommodate
 everyone.
- Some progress is taking place regarding connection with the St John Accord facility.
- Parish attempts to connect with the school include a letter of encouragement to year 6 students and the offer of a video presentation of Bishop Robert Barron's "Eucharist" for parents prior to school pick-up.

When Jesus names love as the greatest commandment he does not limit it to 'heart' love. We must love God, ourselves and others with our whole person and that means physically, spiritually and rationally. Jesus indicates that love is a way of life and intrinsic to biblical law and wisdom.

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A

First Reading Ex 22:20-26

If you are harsh with the widow or the orphan, my anger will rage against you.

The Lord said to Moses, 'Tell the sons of Israel this, "You must not molest the stranger or oppress him, for you lived as strangers in the land of Egypt. You must not be harsh with the widow, or with the orphan; if you are harsh with them, they will surely cry out to me, and be sure I shall hear their cry; my anger will flare and I shall kill you with the sword, your own wives will be widows, your own children orphans.

"If you lend money to any of my people, to any poor man among you, you must not play the usurer with him: you must not demand interest from him.

"If you take another's cloak as a pledge, you must give it back to him before sunset. It is all the covering he has; it is the cloak he wraps his body in; what else would he sleep in? If he cries to me, I will listen, for I am full of pity."

Responsorial Psalm Ps 17:2-4. 47. 51. R. v.2

(R.) I love you, Lord, my strength.

 I love you, Lord, my strength, my rock, my fortress, my saviour. My God is the rock where I take refuge; my shield, my mighty help, my stronghold.

Second Reading 1 Thes 1:5-10

You turned away from idols to serve God and await his Son.

You observed the sort of life we lived when we were with you, which was for your instruction, and you were led to become imitators of us, and of the Lord; and it was with the joy of the Holy Spirit that you took to the gospel, in spite of the great opposition all round you. This has made you the great example to all believers in Macedonia and Achaia since it was from you that the word of the Lord started to spread – and not only throughout Macedonia and Achaia, for the news of your faith in God has spread everywhere. We do not need to tell other people about it: other people tell us how we started the work among you, how you broke with idolatry when you were converted to God and became servants of the real, living God; and how you are now waiting for Jesus, his Son, whom he raised from the dead, to come from heaven to save us from the retribution which is coming.

Gospel Acclamation Jn 14:23


Alleluia, alleluia! All who love me will keep my words, and my Father will love them and we will come to them. Alleluia!

Gospel Mt 22:34-40

You shall love the Lord your God and your neighbour as yourself.

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees they got together and, to disconcert him, one of them put a question, 'Master, which is the greatest commandment of the law?' Jesus said, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second resembles it: you must love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang the whole Law, and the Prophets also.'

Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

Did you notice that Our Lord does not command us to love 'God'? No, we are to love 'the *Lord* your God', the One who rescued the Jewish people from slavery. The resurrection of Jesus Christ reveals the Lord God as the liberator from the apparent final dominance of death. Loving such a liberator is the natural response. So, 'Love *the Lord* your God'.

Then Our Lord does not command us to love our neighbour! Rather, 'Love your neighbour as *yourself.*' But who is 'yourself'? In the wonderful story-telling of Genesis, we are told that Adam, an earthen statue, had Divine Breath breathed into the nostrils, creating him as a human being. We earthlings are conceived with the Divine Breath at the core of our being.

The challenge for you and for me is to see 'yourself' in that way, and thereafter every human being whose lives we can affect: the neighbour. And in today's global world, the neighbour can be a person in a society geographically or culturally distant.

We could pause for a moment to see the true dimensions of God, self and the other, to more easily fulfil the dual command.
