TRYBOOKING & QR CODES

UNDER CURRENT RESTRICTIONS 28TH JULY 2021, MASKS MUST BE WORN IN THE CHURCH.

Electronic record keeping became mandatory for all venues and facilities, including our Places of Worship. Importantly, activities involving ceremonies and religious gatherings, within a Place of Worship, must use an electronic record keeping system that is compatible with the Victorian Government's visitation application programming interface (API).

- This density quotient still applies and API compatible electronic record keeping is now mandatory.
- Density Quotient 1 person per 4 sqm applies
- Sacred Heart 60 people. St Thomas 75 people.
- Everyone entering the Church can scan the QR Code.
- In exceptional circumstances, due to age, disability etc., the Parish has the ability to manually record their attendance (and maintain records for a period of 28 days.
- Sacred Heart & St Thomas Parishes will continue to use the Trybooking system to enable parishioners to book in for Mass so we do not exceed our density quotient.

EXPLANATION OF COLLECTIONS

In every Parish, there are two collections and two separate accounts,

The Presbytery collection/account (1st coll.) provides the pastoral stipend and living costs of the Priest. The Church collection/account (2nd coll.) provides for the maintenance, office and staff expenses of the Parish.

LETTER TO PARISHIONERS

Dear Parishioner,

In mid-2020 I formed an Establishment Committee for the Safeguarding of Children and Young People of our Partnered Parishes of Sacred Heart, Diamond Creek, St. Mary's, Greensborough and St. Thomas the Apostle, Greensborough North. This Committee's work centred on developing policies and practices in order for us to be compliant with both Government and Archdiocese of Melbourne requirements around protecting children and young people.

The Establishment Committee, which has done a monumental task, has been coordinated by Helen Anderson, whom I seconded immediately after her retirement from her principalship at St. Mary's, and has consisted of Jacinta Bright and Sr. Margaret Sapsford, Parish Pastoral Associates, Leon Kempen (St Mary's), Chris Aicher St. Thomas the Apostle), Wendy and Ray McEvoy (Sacred Heart). I have also been an active member over the past year. I also wrote two letters to you on behalf of the Establishment Committee in September and November to communicate to you the progress of their work. This Establishment Committee has now completed its task of developing policies and practices for our parishes which are all available to be viewed on the Parish Websites.

Now a Committee for the Safeguarding of Children and Young People with representatives from each of the three Parishes, has been formed to implement, monitor and review these policies and practices, and to develop a culture among all of us that actively provides for the safety of children and young people. This Safeguarding Committee currently consists of Moira Willits, Jim Kelly-Viney, Tim Hamilton (St. Mary's), Ray Belli, Ronan McIlroy (Sacred Heart), Tim Holland, Michael Bates (St. Thomas'). Sr. Margaret Sapsford, Jacinta Bright and I will continue to be members of the Committee. I thank all of them for their generosity. I would welcome more members onto this Committee so that the tasks required by its members might be distributed more widely. You will be hearing from the members of the Committee as they seek to assist you to ensure the care, safety and wellbeing of children and young people in our parishes. Complying with and living out our commitment to protecting our young people will require new expectations of us all and this Committee will assist us to do so.

I would like to express my deep gratitude to all the members of the Establishment Committee, now that it has completed its task, for their dedication and hard work, and especially to Helen Anderson for her committed leadership and professional guidance, ensuring that the work is completed.

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

First Reading Rv 11:19; 12:1-6, 10

I saw a woman clothed with the sun and with the moon at her feet.

The sanctuary of God in heaven opened, and the ark of the covenant could be seen inside it.

Now a great sign appeared in heaven: a woman, adorned with the sun, standing on the moon, and with the twelve stars on her head for a crown. She was pregnant, and in labour, crying aloud in the pangs of childbirth. Then a second sign appeared in the sky, a huge red dragon which had seven heads and ten horns, and each of the seven heads crowned with a coronet. Its tail dragged a third of the stars from the sky and dropped them to the earth, and the dragon stopped in front of the woman as she was having the child, so that he could eat it as soon as it was born from its mother. The woman brought a male child into the world, the son who was to rule all the nations with an iron sceptre, and the child was taken straight up to God and to his throne, while the woman escaped into the desert, where God had made a place of safety ready. Then I heard a voice shout from heaven, 'Victory and power and empire for ever have been won by our God, and all authority for his Christ."

Second Reading 1 Cor 15:20-26

As members of Christ all people will be raised, Christ first, and after him all who belong to him.

Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of all who have fallen asleep. Death came through one man and in the same way the resurrection of the dead has come through one man. Just as all men die in Adam, so all men will be brought to life in Christ; but all of them in their proper order; Christ as the first-fruits and then, after the coming of Christ, those who belong to him. After that will come the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, having done away with every sovereignty, authority and power. For he must be king until he has put all his enemies under his feet and the last of the enemies to be destroyed is death, for everything is to be put under his feet.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia! Mary is taken up to heaven, and the angels of God shout for joy. Alleluia!

Gospel Lk 1:39-56

The Almighty has done great things for me; he has lifted up the lowly.

Mary set out and went as quickly as she could to a town in the hill country of Judah. She went into Zechariah's house and greeted Elizabeth. Now as soon as Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. She gave a loud cry and said, 'Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.'

And Mary said:

- 'My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord
- and my spirit exults in God my saviour;

because he has looked upon his lowly handmaid.

- Yes, from this day forward all generations will call me blessed,
- for the Almighty has done great things for me.
- Holy is his name,
- and his mercy reaches from age to age for those who fear him.
- He has shown the power of his arm,
- he has routed the proud of heart.
- He has pulled down princes from their thrones and exalted the lowly.

The hungry he has filled with good things, the rich sent empty away.

- He has come to the help of Israel his servant, mindful of his mercy
- according to the promise he made to our ancestors –
- of his mercy to Abraham and to his descendants for ever.'
- Mary stayed with Elizabeth about three months and then went back home.

the surface, today's 0n gospel passage has little to do with the feast of the Assumption. There is no scriptural account of the Assumption and so we draw on a different significant gospel passage that features Mary. However, the account of Mary rushing to her cousin and exuberantly proclaiming the Magnificat is an example of Mary's joyful 'Yes' to life and to God that tradition tells us was rewarded in her bodily assumption into heaven.

Immediately prior to this account, the angel Gabriel has announced to Mary that she is to give birth to the Christchild. Her humble response to the angel and to God is, 'Let it be done to me according to your word' even though she knew the shame and rejection her pregnancy would cause in her village. Whilst her initial response is subdued and humble, it is a 'Yes' to God's will. Mary's next instinct is an emphatic 'Yes' to life. The angel tells Mary that her cousin, Elizabeth, is also to bear a child. Elizabeth was an older woman and keenly felt the social and cultural shame of not being able to bear children. When Mary hears that Elizabeth is already pregnant she rushes to be with her. Where no life was thought possible, God has created life. Elizabeth would have been shamed and regarded as inadequate and of lesser standing because of her childlessness. In many ways, Elizabeth was deprived of her own life because she could not give birth. Mary's "Yes" to God and "Yes" to life is confirmed and amplified by God's granting fullness of life to Elizabeth.
