THEME FOR ADVENT

The theme for Advent this year is Messengers of Hope. In today's world, it can often be hard to see signs of hope, for our planet, in our communities, for our families. Once again war, tragedy, violence and natural disasters have challenged and upset our sense of peace and safety. Fear, uncertainty and self-interest have flourished at times when love, generosity and reconciliation were needed. In the history of our Church, we have always had messengers of hope to remind us of the love of God: the prophets, the angels, the saints, John the Baptist, to name a few. This Advent, let us look around for messengers of hope and as a start we need to look no further than our children. These young ones, full of life and promise, are the children of God, loved by Jesus and our hope for the future.

"Let the children come to me, do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of God" (Mark 10:14)

SECOND WEEK OF ADVENT

In the Gospel this week written by Mark, he begins by identifying his purpose for writing: he proclaims that Jesus is the Son of God and the Messiah – He has arrived as prophesised. What follows is the word of the Lord, the life and the teachings of Christ. Already the reader is filled with anticipation. John the Baptist is our next messenger of hope. He has been sent to prepare the way for Jesus. John has a strong following among the Jews for his honest and humble witness to God but he directs them to the One to come. Their hope will be fulfilled by Jesus and through baptism with the Holy Spirit. And this remains true for us today.

"Be strong, and let your heart take courage, all you who wait for the Lord!" (Psalm 31:24)

BLESSING OF OUR CHRISTMAS STABLE



Lectionary Art and Reflection by Jenny Close Mark's Gospel begins with a narrative about baptism with water and the Holy Spirit. The earthly water washes away the detritus of sin and the Holy Spirit regenerates: the water is ours to use, but the Holy Spirit is pure gift. The focus on repentance and grace is part of our Advent task – to prepare ourselves by reflecting on our lives and seeking forgiveness while we watch and wait.

Second Sunday of Advent, Year B

10 December 2023

First Reading Is 40:1-5. 9-11 Prepare the way for the Lord. 'Console my people, console them' says your God. 'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.' A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God across the desert. Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley; then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.' Go up on a high mountain, joyful messenger to Zion. Shout with a loud voice, joyful messenger to Jerusalem. Shout without fear, say to the towns of Judah, 'Here is your God.' Here is the Lord coming with power, his arm subduing all things to him. The prize of his victory is with him, his trophies all go before him. He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 84:9-14. R. v.8

(R.) Lord, let us see your kindness, and grant us your salvation.

- I will hear what the Lord God has to say, a voice that speaks of peace, peace for his people. His help is near for those who fear him and his glory will dwell in our land. (R.)
- Mercy and faithfulness have met; justice and peace have embraced. Faithfulness shall spring from the earth and justice look down from heaven. (R.)
- 3. The Lord will make us prosper and our earth shall yield its fruit. Justice shall march before him and peace shall follow his steps. (R.)

Second Reading 2 Pt 3:8-14

We wait for new heavens and a new earth.

There is one thing, my friends, that you must never forget: that with the Lord, 'a day' can mean a thousand years, and a thousand years is like a day. The Lord is not being slow to carry out his promises, as anybody else might be called slow; but he is being patient with you all, wanting nobody to be lost and everybody to be brought to change his ways. The Day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then with a roar the sky will vanish, the elements will catch fire and fall apart, the earth and all that it contains will be burnt up.

Since everything is coming to an end like this, you should be living holy and saintly lives while you wait and long for the Day of God to come, when the sky will dissolve in flames and the elements melt in the heat. What we are waiting for is what he promised: the new heavens and new earth, the place where righteousness will be at home. So then, my friends, while you are waiting, do your best to live lives without spot or stain so that he will find you at peace.

Alleluia, alleluia!

Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths:

Gospel Mk 1:1-8

Make straight the paths of the Lord.


The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah:

Look, I am going to send my messenger before you;

he will prepare your way. A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight,

and so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'

Reflection by Dianne Bergant CSA

In the wilderness God's salvation comes to a broken people. In the midst of what is seemingly an impossible situation, hope emerges with vigour. In this context, hope is an openness to surprise, the surprise that God is in no way limited to the imaginings of human minds and the consequences of human history. This is the kind of hope that is proclaimed in the wilderness by John; it is the kind of hope that trusts that from the impossible, God can work a new creation.

There is something of a time warp in Christianity. What is future is made present. The prophetic oracle announces the future as if it is already happening. This sense of the future-present prompts new ways of living. As the future takes root in human lives, the present is transformed into a new creation and the Day of the Lord appears.

God's future comes through the wilderness into the broken city and inspires a broken-hearted people. The contrite heart is a broken heart, an emptied-out heart, a hope-filled heart. It is a heart that is unencumbered by the past and that lives currently in the passing of time and the fragility of being alive. The contrite, broken heart can be filled only by what is promised in the future. This is the paradox of Advent. In the middle of the wilderness, God works the impossible in those whose hearts are ready for the surprise of hope.
