

BAPTISMS AT SACRED HEART

Making a phone call to the Sacred heart Office has more often than not been the first time families make contact or reconnect to Sacred Heart Parish.

The welcoming interested response to this call has always had a profound impact on their initial experience.

Once families are booked in for their child's baptism they are sent the application for baptism, census form and photo sheet. This is then completed and bought to their information evening.

A member of the baptism team receives the names of the families involved along with the phone number in order to make contact with them prior to the meeting. This is another important step towards making them feel that we care and that they are welcomed. The information evening is generally run in the church on the Tuesday prior to the last Sunday of the month. The evening consists of explanation of expectations, faith development and the practical aspects of the Baptismal day. Parents receive an envelope that contains necessary information. These envelopes have been decorated with Baptismal signs and symbols by the year 3 students in the school. This is a tangible way for school parish connection and the students connecting to those making the sacrament of Baptism. The Sunday following this evening families attend the 9am Mass to be presented to the parish community. From what they have learnt they formulate a response to the question 'What do you ask for your child?' and share this with the community. This is

followed by a placing of the sign of the cross on the children to be baptised from the priest, parents and parishioners. The following Sunday is the Baptism held at 12pm. During the ceremony family involvement occurs including members of families

doing the reading and intercessions.

Photos are on display in the church for that month so parishioners are encouraged to remember them in their prayers. At then end of

the month the photos are taken down and posted back to families along with a hand made congratulatory card for the child.

Also included is a save the date card for the welcome back for all families of those baptised during the year. This is held in November.

At the end of October an email is sent to all families who have had their children baptised throughout the year to invite them to the welcome back Mass.

This Mass is currently held on the 3rd Sunday in November. During this Mass families process in at the beginning and place their children's candle at the front of the altar where they are lit prior to the creed. Just before the creed families come forward to collect their candles and stand facing the congregation as the creed is recited, reinforcing the promises made at Baptism. At the end of Mass morning tea is provided by the Baptism team to complete the celebration.

Families always respond enthusiastically to this process and very much appreciate the personal touch and welcoming that we provide. This is a strong link for them to the parish without feeling a lot of pressure.

SACRED HEART NEWS CONTINUED

Dear Parishioners of Sacred Heart, Diamond Creek,

I apologise that I cannot be with you as we farewell Pat Guatta who has been our secretary for almost the last 21 years. Pat, who had been a long-time parishioner of Sacred Heart, was employed by Fr. Grant O'Neill at the end of 2003. She was then the compassionate voice and welcoming face of the parish office in the aftermath of the Black Friday Bushfires of 2009 with Fr. Grant and Sr. Margaret Ryan. Fr. Grant remained parish priest through the rebuilding of the Kinglake church after it was destroyed by the fire. Then Pat held together the parish in an uncertain and intervening period of time when Fr. Grant was appointed to Kilmore in 2011 and Sacred Heart was essentially left without a parish priest for a number of months until Fr. Michael McEntee, the incumbent parish priest of St. Thomas' was appointed to also take responsibility for the parish of Sacred Heart. Then came the real challenge for Sacred Heart parishioners to accept that they were now in a partnership with another parish.

This, of course also became a time of grief and uncertainty, but Pat supported Fr. Michael in reassuring the parishioners of Sacred Heart that they weren't just subsumed into some big amalgam, losing their identity. Then in 2017 Sacred Heart parish was then merged into a partnership with St. Mary's, Greensborough, as well, with me being the parish priest since that time. Yet another time of upheaval.

In other words, Pat has not only been the secretary of this parish, but a true pastoral carer for these people of Sacred Heart, whom she has loved. Other leaders of this parish – priests and pastoral associates – have come and gone, but Pat has been the steady mainstay and "rock of stability' throughout some very turbulent times. She has not only been faithful in her care for you, but to all of us who have been her employers as parish priests, she has been a dependable, competent, reliable and honest administrator of our Sacred Heart community who has also worked well with the staff of our parish school.

Pat has been so dedicated to this community that she has put in so much more than what her job description asked of her, because of her love for the people of this parish community.

This has been her life, and not just her job. For her faithful dedication to Sacred Heart and her loyalty to me as her parish priest, and her previous parish priests, I am truly grateful. I would also like to express my gratitude to her husband, Peter, and their son, Michael, enabling Pat to be for us all she has been.

Pat still remains part of our community and I trust that she will continue to enjoy our company as she engages in other areas of this parish's life.

Pat, your retirement is well deserved, and your work among us and for us is greatly appreciated. I pray that your future retirement offers great opportunities for enjoyment and adventures with friends and family and that God blesses you with peace, good health and joy also among us for many more years.

As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from

This is the bread come down from heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead,

but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.'

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Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

When I was a boy (is it so long ago?) it was still the rule at Mass that only the priest drank from the chalice. One of the great actions of the Church over the last fifty years has been the recovery of the ancient practice of offering Holy Communion under the appearance of both bread and wine.

The reception of both the consecrated bread and the consecrated wine is in perfect harmony with today's Gospel: 'Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life.' Note the present tense: 'has' – right now! This is because, as St John Paul II put it: 'We digest, as it were, the secret of the Resurrection.'

Of course, Our Risen Lord is really present under the appearance of either the bread or the wine. For a Jew, (unlike the Greeks) the *body* was absolutely core to being the person one is. For a Jew, *blood* was identified as the life-force of any animal. So, for the Jewish Jesus, to say 'This is my body... this is my blood' was to gift us his core identity, his deepest vitality. Either the consecrated bread or consecrated wine gives us His whole life.

But to receive both the Heavenly Bread and the Spiritual Drink does enable us to more fully respond to Our Lord at the Last Supper: 'Take, eat ... take, drink'. Then the words of today's Gospel can more physically resonate in our own bodies: 'He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I in him.'

We could take a moment to pray in thanksgiving that we are able to join in the tradition starting with the Apostles at the Last Supper and, in doing so, to enter into Holy Communion with the only One who can embody in us the secret of His resurrection.
