REFLECTION This week's readings speak of our need to entrust all that we are and all that we do, to our God who will guide and help us. The First Reading speaks of our joy in the power of the Lord to overcome war and violence, and bring the peace of his kingdom. We pray for the gentle and humble way of proceeding that is God's way for us. St Paul (Second Reading) reminds us that the Holy Spirit living within us will give us life and show us the way to live.

Jesus speaks of the need to come to him with a child-like trust: he knows we cannot understand or fulfil all that he asks of us in our own strength. We may try, but find our labouring is burdensome.

When Jesus promises us rest in Him, He does not promise us a long life, lots of riches, all kinds of pleasures, etc. Instead, Jesus is clear that the way to a full and complete life is through the cross. We must embrace Jesus and begin to walk with Him and we will find that the cross is easy to bear because He is with us. His yoke is easy and His burden is light only if we are willing to walk with him through suffering and death to life. Being yoked to Him makes all things possible.
