FIRST READING

A reading from the first book of the Kings

3:5.7-12

The Lord appeared to Solomon in a dream and said, 'Ask what you would like me to give you.' Solomon replied, 'Lord, my God, you have made your servant king in succession to David my father. But I am a very young man, unskilled in leadership. Your servant finds himself in the midst of this people of yours that you have chosen, a people so many its numbers cannot be counted or reckoned. Give your servant a heart to understand how to discern between good and evil, for who could govern this people of yours that is so great?' It pleased the Lord that Solomon should have asked for this. 'Since you have asked for this' the Lord said 'and not asked for long life for yourself or riches or the lives of your enemies, but have asked for a discerning judgement for yourself, here and now I do what you ask. I give you a heart wise and shrewd as none before you has had and none will have after you.' *The word of the Lord*.

GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 13:44-46

Jesus said to the crowds, 'The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field which someone has found; he hides it again, goes off happy, sells everything he owns and buys the field.

'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls; when he finds one of great value he goes and sells everything he owns and buys it.

The Gospel of the Lord.

Today's readings teach us that Faith in Jesus as our God and Saviour and sacrificing everything in life to do the will of God are equivalent to discovering and possessing the most valuable treasure or the pearl of great price. In other words, keeping a personal relationship with Jesus, remaining in a state of grace, and sharing his view of life are the most beautiful and the most precious things in the world. We should live every moment in view of our precious goal.

Most of the time, we are chasing false treasures such as money, social status, or worldly pleasures. Thus, the really valuable "pearl" of sharing in God's life through Jesus here on earth and later in Heaven, is never found. Let us always remember that Heaven is within the reach of all of us who try to do the will of God, following the ordinary vocations of life and enjoying this world's joys and pleasures within the framework of God's Commandments. When we do this, we are already living in the Kingdom of Heaven while we are still on earth.

DATES TO REMEMBER IN AUGUST...

Wed 2 Aug to Sun 6 Aug - World Youth Day in Lisbon Portugal .. A gathering of young people from all over the world and attended by the Pope. It is also a pilgrimage, a celebration of youth, an expression of the universal Church and an intense moment of evangelization for the youth world. Let us remember the youth in our prayers, especially those from our own Archdiocese attending WYD Lisbon. Many of you will also remember when in July 2008 our parish hosted pilgrims from Germany, Kuwait and Barbados, before they travelled to Sydney for World Youth Day 2008 attended by Pope Benedict.

Fri 4 Aug - St John Marie Vianney was a French Catholic priest. Pope Pius X proposed him as a model of parochial clergy for his extraordinary devotion and life which he committed to the church ministry. He was canonized by Pope Pius XI on May 31, 1925, and named the **patron saint of parish priests in 1929**. The life and vocation of St John Marie Vianney shows us the importance of the priest's role in the spiritual transformation of their communities. St Vianney was able to transcend over his limitations and humble beginnings to become an exemplary priest who changed his town and even the world.
