## **GOSPEL**

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

16:13-20

When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say he is John the Baptist, some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he said, 'who do you say I am?' Then Simon Peter spoke up, 'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.' Then he gave the disciples strict orders not to tell anyone that he was the Christ. *The Gospel of the Lord*.

In today's Gospel we have the famous story of the keys. Peter has discovered the key to understanding who Jesus is: "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God", and Jesus responds by giving him the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever he binds or looses on earth will be bound or loosed in heaven. These two are keys represented on the Vatican flag: the silver key represents worldly power, being the pope's authority on earth as the successor of Peter and the gold key represents spiritual power, being his authority in heaven. The flag is yellow and white, which reminds us that we are to be the light of the world—the yellow part—and the salt of the earth—the white part. ## FATHER'S DAY APPEAL FOR RETIRED PRIESTS

Father's Day (next Sunday 3 September) is the traditional day for the annual collection for the Priest's Retirement Foundation. There are 95 Melbourne Priests who are currently retired. 10 retired priests are aged in their 90's; 48 in their 80's; and 27 between 75-80. Most have served 50 years in parish ministry before retiring (at age 75). This appeal is one of four main income streams to support our retired priests.

A Third Collection will be held at all Masses next weekend. Donation envelopes are also available for pick up this weekend (if you would like a receipt).

"It has been a wonderful custom in the Archdiocese of Melbourne to allow the faithful of the Archdiocese to show something of their own appreciation through an annual Fathers' Day Appeal. The appeal goes to the care of retired and sick priests by providing suitable accommodation, medical assistance and a comfortable standard of living for them....
