## October: The Month of the Holy Rosary October 7 is the Liturgical Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary

By tradition, the Catholic Church dedicates each month of the year to a certain devotion. The month of October is dedicated to the holy Rosary, one of the best known of all Catholic devotions. October includes the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary (October 7).

Legend tells us that the Rosary as a form of prayer was given to St. Dominic (1170-1221) by Mary, the Mother of Our Lord, who entrusted it to him as an aid in the conflicts with the Albigensians. The Dominican pope, St. Pius V,

did much to further the spread of the Rosary and it became one of the most popular devotions in Christendom.

Many popes have contributed to help increase devotion to the Rosary by their writings. John Paul II called the Rosary his favourite prayer, in which we meditate with Mary upon the mysteries which she as a mother meditated on in her heart (Lk. 2:19) (*Osservatore Romano*, 44; 30 Oct. 1979).

The purpose of the rosary is to help us meditate on the great mysteries of our salvation. The main focus is on Jesus—his birth, life, death and resurrection. The Our Fathers remind us that Jesus' Father is the initiator of salvation. The Hail Mary's remind us to join with Mary in contemplating these mysteries. They also make us aware that Mary was and is intimately joined with her Son in all the mysteries of his earthly and heavenly existence. The Glory Be's remind us that the purpose of all life is the glory of the Trinity.

The rosary appeals to many. It is simple. The constant repetition of words helps create an atmosphere in which to contemplate the mysteries of God. We sense that Jesus and Mary are with us in the joys and sorrows of life. We grow in hope that God will bring us to share in the glory of Jesus and Mary forever. The beauty of the Rosary is that we can pray it anytime and anywhere. There are many ways we can "know" Mary; praying the Rosary is a wonderful way to do so for it connects us to Our Lady and it helps us learn more about her life and the life of Christ.

In this month of October, let us consider this beautiful prayer of the Rosary as a means that we too can grow closer to Jesus and Mary by meditating on the great mysteries of our salvation. (Excerpts from Rev M R Mauriello & Franciscan Media)


