# Pope Francis Message for Lent 2021

In his message for Lent 2021, Pope Francis says that Lent is a time for believing, for welcoming God into our lives and allowing him to "make his dwelling" among us (cf. Jn 14:23). The Holy Father reminds the faithful that the Lenten practices of fasting, almsgiving and prayer make it possible for us to live lives of sincere faith, living hope and effective charity, thereby sharing in Jesus' mission of the salvation of the world. 'The call to experience Lent as a journey of conversion, prayer and sharing of our goods, helps us — as communities and as individuals — to revive the faith that comes from the living Christ, the hope inspired by the breath of the Holy Spirit and the love flowing from the merciful heart of the Father.' Pope Francis also explains that the sacrament of reconciliation plays a pivotal role in our ability to 'spread forgiveness to others' having received it ourselves. This, he says, enables us to enter dialogue with others and to comfort those in pain and sorrow: 'God's forgiveness, offered also through our words and actions, enables us to experience an Easter of fraternity.'

If you are looking for suggestions for a fast this Lent, why not consider some of these suggestions inspired by Pope Francis...

Fast from hurting words and say kind words
Fast from sadness and be filled with gratitude
Fast from anger and be filled with patience
Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope
Fast from worries and trust in God
Fast from complaints and contemplate simplicity
Fast from pressures and be prayerful
Fast from bitterness and fill your heart with joy
Fast from selfishness and be compassionate to others
Fast from grudges and be reconciled
Fast from words and be silent so you can listen



# March is dedicated to St Joseph

The Catholic Church dedicates the entire month of March to St. Joseph and urges us to pay special attention to his life and example. In the 20th century, several popes had a deep devotion to St. Joseph.

St Joseph had a profound faith life. He would attend daily mass and would be seen in deep prayer. His internal life would be far beyond anything we can imagine, having constant conversations with God in

Joseph's trust in God would give him strength through the toughest situations and temptations. Pope Pius IX proclaimed Saint Joseph the patron of the Universal Church in 1870. Having died in the "arms of Jesus and Mary" according to Catholic tradition, he is considered the model of the pious believer who receives grace at the moment of death, in other words, the patron of a happy death.

I have always seen those who honoured him in a special manner make progress in virtue, for this heavenly protector favours in a striking manner the spiritual advancement of souls who commend themselves to him." 
