2nd Sunday of Easter Yr A (Divine Mercy Sunday) - 19th April 2020



Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter. It is based on the private revelations of St. Faustina Kowalska, which recommended a particular devotion to the Divine Mercy.

Divine Mercy Sunday focuses on the gift of **mercy** and love given through Christ's death, burial, and resurrection. As Pope John Paul II stated, "**Divine Mercy** reaches human beings through the heart of Christ crucified."

St. Faustina was born in 1905. Through her and her diary, Jesus communicates to the world the message of His Mercy. Not only have we been blessed with the Divine Mercy Chaplet and Divine Mercy Novena, but St Faustina's diary provides inspiring quotes and reflections/meditations to help, guide and comfort us in our everyday life.

"When I see that the burden is beyond my strength, I do not consider or analyse it or probe into it, but I run like a child to the Heart of Jesus and say only one word to Him: "You can do all things." And then I keep silent, because I know that Jesus Himself will intervene in the matter, and as for me, instead of tormenting myself, I use that time to love Him."
