GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

18:9-14

Jesus spoke the following parable to some people who prided themselves on being virtuous and despised everyone else. 'Two men went up to the Temple to pray, one a Pharisee, the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood there and said this prayer to himself, "I thank you, God, that I am not grasping, unjust, adulterous like the rest of mankind, and particularly that I am not like this tax collector here. I fast twice a week; I pay tithes on all I get." The tax collector stood some distance away, not daring even to raise his eyes to heaven; but he beat his breast and said, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." This man, I tell you, went home again at rights with God; the other did not. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles himself will be exalted.' *The Gospel of the Lord*.

Praying with Humility..... Rank and status are unimportant in God's eyes, since he loves all men equally. God is far more concerned with the openness of a person's heart. If it is closed with hypocrisy or self-righteousness then a relationship with God cannot develop. If it is open in humility, growth is immediately possible, however unpromising the material may seem.
