



ADVENT SEASON

Today we light the rose candle (called the "Shepherd's Candle") of the Advent wreath. To the shepherd's great joy, the angels announced that Jesus came for humble, unimportant people like them too. In liturgy, the colour rose signifies joy. The priest wears rose vestments, to express our communal joy in the coming of Jesus as our Saviour. We rejoice because:

- we will soon be celebrating the day of Christ's birth,
- we recognize Jesus' daily presence in our midst, and
- we wait for Christ's return in glory.

Advent is a time for joy, not only because we are anticipating the anniversary of the birth of Jesus, but also because God is already in our midst. Christian joy does not come from the absence of sorrow, pain, or trouble, but from an awareness of the presence of Christ within our souls through it all.

A reading from the prophet Zephaniah

3:14-18

Shout for joy, daughter of Zion,
Israel, shout aloud!
Rejoice, exult with all your heart,
daughter of Jerusalem!
The Lord has repealed your sentence;
he has driven your enemies away.
The Lord, the king of Israel, is in your midst;
you have no more evil to fear.
When that day comes, word will come to Jerusalem:
Zion, have no fear,
do not let your hands fall limp.
The Lord your God is in your midst,
a victorious warrior.

he will renew you by his love;
he will dance with shouts of joy for you
as on a day of festival.

GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 3:10-18

When all the people asked John. ‘What must we do?’ he answered, ‘If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.’ There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, ‘Master, what must we do?’ He said to them, ‘Exact no more than your rate.’ Some soldiers asked him in their turn, ‘What about us? What must we do?’ He said to them, ‘No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!’

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, ‘I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.’ As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.

The special year dedicated to St Joseph (8 Dec 2020 - 8 Dec 2021), marking the occasion of the 150th anniversary of the proclamation of St Joseph as patron of the Universal Church, came to a close, on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. Archbishop Comensoli reflects on why St Joseph remains such an important figure in the life of our Church, and what relevance he has for us in today's world.



“As we come to the conclusion of this year to St Joseph, can I just offer you some words that Pope Francis himself has reflected upon St Joseph:

How many people daily exercise patience and offer hope, taking care to spread not panic, but shared responsibility. How many fathers, mothers, grandparents and teachers are showing our children, in small everyday ways, how to accept and deal with a crisis by adjusting their routines, looking ahead and encouraging the practice of prayer. How many are praying, making sacrifices and interceding for the good of all.’

Each of us can discover St Joseph in our lives. And I encourage you even as this special year comes to a conclusion to nonetheless continue to seek the friendship of St Joseph in your life, and that he might indeed be a friend for us all.
