



The Holy Family models for us what family life should exemplify. It is a school of virtue for both parents and children. There we find God, and learn how to connect with God and with others. The family is where love is freely given without self-interest. It is where we learn to love, to pray and to practice the gift of charity. Pope John Paul II has said, "The family, more than any other human reality, is the place in which the person is loved for himself and in which he learns to live the sincere gift of self" (Nov. 27, 2002).

Parenting is a very challenging responsibility and at times errors are made despite the best intentions. With this in mind, let us pray to the Holy Family for help and guidance.

During this period of uncertainty, the Mass times will continue as follows:

Four weekday Masses: Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursday and Fridays at 9.30am

Two weekend Masses: Saturday Vigil at 5 pm & Sunday at 10.00 am

Pre-registration for Mass is no longer required however COVID 19 safety and hygiene guidelines will be strictly adhered to, therefore numbers are limited and once our full quota has been reached, the Church doors will close.

WE ASK THAT PARISHIONERS ARRIVE EARLY FOR MASS in order to register in time for the start of Mass, and also to avoid congregating outside the entrance. Thank you for your understanding.

Social distancing (2 metres) must be maintained and face masks are no longer compulsory inside the church however we strongly recommend masks are worn especially if social distancing cannot be maintained. If you are awaiting Covid test results or you are feeling unwell, please do not come to Church.
