

Today's readings tell us how the early Church accepted the challenge of keeping Jesus' memory alive by remaining a dynamic Christian community, bearing witness to Christ by their unity, fidelity in worship and spirit of loving, humble service. Today's Gospel introduces Jesus as the

Way to God, the Truth to be accepted, and the Life to be shared and lived.

"IS ANYONE DOWN THERE?"

There is the story of a man who fell off a cliff. On the way down he manages to grab a tree limb. Peering into a deep canyon, he calls out, "Help, please. Is anyone down there?" After an unbearable silence, a voice answers, "Yes, I am here." "Who are you?" the man shouts. "It's Me, the Lord!" Greatly relieved, the man says, "Thank you. Have you come to rescue me?" "Yes," says the Lord. "Let go. I will catch you." The man thinks for a second, and then asks, "Is there anyone else down there?"

Well, we can understand the man's reluctance to let go, but, in reality, there is no one else down there. Jesus says it quite plainly this Sunday, "I am the Way" (Jn 14:6). He does not say **a** way, but **the** way.
