Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord - 12th April 2020



My dear parishioners,

Greetings in the great and holy name of the resurrected Christ.

Holy Week holds a very special place in the hearts of all Christians. Yet this year we are witnessing a strange and frightful time. We are living the experience of this Holy Week and Easter in our own homes due to the restrictions caused by COVID-19. It will be unlike any other Easter we have ever had.

On the Sabbath, at dawn, the women and the disciples found that the tomb was empty. This shows that Christ emptied himself so that we may be grace filled. He detached himself from worldly pleasures. Especially at this time, we are detaching ourselves from worldly pleasures. We are being asked to self- isolate and to be apart from our families and friends. We are being made worthy to be God's children, to participate in the glory of his resurrection and to be heirs of heaven.

Our hearts are sad to witness the deadly disease of COVID-19 that has taken the lives of so many of our brothers and sisters in the Lord. They have gone before us to see the resurrected Christ face to face marked with the sign of faith.

The pandemic is making the suffering of vulnerable people even deeper. Many feel alone with nowhere to turn. In the midst of all this sadness, loss and anxiety, we have a very real opportunity to journey more intentionally as a domestic church through Holy Week. As we gather in our home – with those we live with or individually – we gather seeking God's mercy and healings and the end of this deadly pandemic. We as the people of God are united with them through our faith and prayers.

We are asked to live in isolation, yet we are growing more closer to God. We communicate with one another at this time in a special way through phone communications. At the same time, we also communicate with God through the medium of prayers. Prayer is the bridge that connects both the ends to and fro, and with open hearts we unite ourselves in spiritual participation and communion with one another and with God.

This week taps into the deepest elements of our faith in Jesus – his death and resurrection. The 40 days of spiritual preparations and spiritual renewal we did practice the cardinal virtues of praying alone, fasting and almsgiving. We know that beyond the pain of Good Friday, comes the joy of Easter Sunday. Now with great hope, faith and love let us renew our trust in God and let us join together in a spiritual way, yet as a community, to pray that this darkness will soon pass and together we shall overcome. Let us pray to find the deeper meaning of this challenge that is facing the whole of humanity and which is calling us to faith and to resurrection.

In the darkness of this crisis, the light of Christ will shine! May this special Easter celebration bring you, your families and loved ones the Easter joy and peace and may the blessings of the resurrected Christ be with you all. *Fr Raj*
