

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF EASTER

Easter is the greatest and the most important feast in the Church for three reasons:

- 1) The Resurrection of Christ is the basis of our Christian Faith. It is the greatest of the miracles, for it proves that Jesus is God. That is why St. Paul writes: "If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain; and your Faith is in vain" (I Cor 15:14).
- 2) Easter is the guarantee of our own resurrection. Jesus assured Martha at the tomb of Laza-

rus: "I am the Resurrection and the Life; whoever believes in Me will live even though he dies" (Jn 11:25-26).

3) Easter is a feast which gives us hope and encouragement in this world of pain, sorrows, and tears. It reminds us that life is worth living. It is our belief in the Real Presence of the Risen Jesus in our souls, in His Church, in the Blessed Sacrament, and in Heaven that gives meaning to our personal as well as our communal prayer, strength to fight against temptations, and freedom from unnecessary worries and fears. OUR 2021 PASCHAL CANDLE

This year our Paschal candle comes from the Benedictine Nuns at Jamberoo Abbey in NSW.

Especially because of the dark days of the universal Covid 19 crisis, the design was inspired by the Coptic Icons of "The Harrowing of Hell", Holy Saturday and the Apostles Creed, "He was crucified, died and was buried: He descended into Hell. The third day he arose again from the dead...." Jesus, the Christ rises from the Earth, the Sun for his Nimbus Halo, Redeemer of the whole Universe. In the band, Jesus, the Christ leans into Hell pulling to himself a man and a woman symbolising all those waiting there.

HONOURING ST JOSEPH - With the donations received on St Joseph Feast Day, Fr Fragapane suggested that it be used for something to honour St Joseph. Our incense thurible was very worn and old so a new thurible for our Church has been purchased in honour of St Joseph in this Year of St Joseph 2021.
