'So you are a king then?' said Pilate. 'It is you who say it' answered Jesus. 'Yes, I am a king. I was born for this, I came into the world for this: to bear witness to the truth; and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice.'

The Gospel of the Lord.

This Sunday, at the end of Church's liturgical year, the readings describe the enthronement of the victorious Christ as King in Heaven in all His glory.

Christ's kingdom, based on the power of love instead of weapons, strong in weakness and vulnerability, and forgiving without revenge, presents a very different image from an earthly kingdom. Yet this is the kingdom that will never be overthrown, or decay from within.

Love is the strongest power of all, and Christ is the king of love.
