Luke 1:26-38

John 1:1-5. 9-14




In celebrating Christmas, and wanting to celebrate the "true meaning of Christmas", we will focus strongly on the newborn child in the manger in the presence of Mary and Joseph, and the shepherds when they arrive, (sheep and cattle are not mentioned in the biblical account). It is always wonderful to contemplate the birth of a child. We have all felt the thrill of the arrival of a new little person in our family, or the birth of a new little one to dear friends of ours. Our faith that in this little one, whose birth we celebrate at Christmas, God has made God's Self present in human flesh adds another wonderful dimension to this joy, as we marvel at the scene in Bethlehem.

We find this faith expressed in another wonderful way in the Gospel of John. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God" (John 1:1) "And the Word became flesh and lived among us" (John 1:14). These words are part of the Gospel reading for Christmas morning Mass, (John 1:1-5, 9-14)

For an even deeper understanding of the "true meaning of Christmas", as well as contemplating the scene at the crib, we also need to go beyond Bethlehem. The words, from today's Gospel, of the angel Gabriel to Mary (quoted above) on the occasion of the conception of Jesus remind us of who this little child is – "the Son of the Most High, on the throne of David, of whose kingdom there will be no end." He is the one who, after his baptism by John in the Jordan, will, by word and action, proclaim the Good News of God's eternal and infinite love for all humanity, pass through death and resurrection, and welcome us into the kingdom of which there will be no end. With mature adult faith we can both thrill at the celebration of his birth, and keep in mind, the whole story.
