REFLECTION Changing the goal posts

We sometimes use the expression 'changing the goal posts' to describe a situation when a new, previously unknown, condition is prescribed. Today's Gospel does just that. The Old Testament had given some information about the long-awaited saviour of Israel, the Messiah, or in Greek, the Christ. He was to be in the line of King David, he was to be born in Bethlehem, and he was to be God's chosen one. Jesus adds to the criteria for being a

Messiah - that he must suffer and die.

Nothing in the Scriptures suggested this, which is why the death of Jesus destroyed the hopes of his first disciples. To them, his death meant failure. God had abandoned him, and their hopes were in vain. Jesus changes the goal posts to include suffering and death as part of his being the Messiah. Rather than being a sign of rejection by God, his death needs to be understood in another framework.

I find this helpful. There is much about God's ways I do not understand. Theological words don't always meet my need for consolation or certainty. There are times I just have to accept that God's goal posts are different from mine. God's perception is bigger than mine. Jesus reveals this explicitly to is disciples, 'Your way of understanding wasn't big enough'. Notice how even when they see Jesus, the Gospel says, 'They could not believe it'. Jesus needed to explain to them and stretch their understanding to accept what their eyes saw. Jesus is risen. A new dimension of human living is revealed. God's love is stronger than death.

NEED TO DISPOSE OF A VEHICLE?

Disposal of a car from a deceased estate, or when a family member has had to relinquish their licence or go into residential care, can be a challenging process. Getting a roadworthy, taking photos to advertise on the internet, cleaning and polishing, taking calls (if they come), even finding a garage until a prospective buyer turns up (if indeed they do!).

If you need to dispose of a vehicle from a deceased estate or which is no longer required, could you consider gifting it to the "Lifeboat Foundation", a registered charity with tax deductible status, which for ten years has been providing pastoral and practical support to nearly 150 victims / survivors across Australia of church-related sexual abuse.

Many of these suffer Post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), and have had limited or no employment., A donated vehicle could vastly improve their quality of life and / or generate much-needed funds to assist personal, medical and accommodation needs.

Caritas Australia's Sudan Crisis Appeal

Following the outbreak of conflict in Sudan a year ago, 25 million people - including 14 million children - now need humanitarian assistance and support, according to the <u>United Nations</u>. 9 million have been displaced from their homes making Sudan the largest displacement crisis in the world!

Damage to infrastructure has impacted access to food, water, healthcare services, and even banking. Sudan now teeters on the edge of a famine.

Since the outbreak of violence Caritas partners in Sudan have distributed food at 17 gathering points for internally displaced people, as well as delivering multipurpose cash assistance, water and hygiene services, and gender-based violence protection. Partners also have access to remote border towns in Chad and South Sudan, enabling them to support those displaced overseas.

As late as the end of last year, one partner reported seeing 4,200 refugees arrive there each day, around 90% of them women and girls.

The Sudan Catholic Bishops Conference has raised concerns "the international community has forgotten the Sudan crisis" and called on the Caritas network across the world to "engage their respective governments, donors, and the wider international community to urgently pick up and advocate for the needed resources to avert the looming famine."

Caritas Australia take solace in the breadth of our partner network in the region. Their tireless work ensures the generosity of our supporters here in Australia reaches people in need.
