### Reflection 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter

In today's gospel, Jesus uses the parable of the vine and its branches to explain the unity between him and the believers.

In order to understand this parable clearly, we need to know the importance of the grapevine. It was a prized possession in the ancient Middle East because it provided a reliable beverage since water was generally not safe to drink.

Vine trees offered a source of relaxation and plenty of sweet, succulent fruits for hot summer days. Much care was taken when planting and maintaining the vine.

Jesus used the connection between the vine and its branches to describe the relationship between him and us. He is the true Vine and we are the branches.

In baptism we are united to him. As branches drive saplings from the tree and grow, our souls drive existence from Jesus, nourished by the word and the Holy Eucharist. Just as branches cannot survive without the Vine, none of us can be productive and alive without Jesus.

Today we are asked to reflect on our spiritual progress.

How is my relationship with Christ going? Am I still believing and living in Him? Am I bearing any good fruit as a Christian?
