

#### SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT B Sunday, 10 December 2023 Embracing the Call to Prepare: Reflections on Mark 1:1-8

As we journey through the season of Advent, our hearts are filled with anticipation and hope as we prepare for the coming of the Lord. This Sunday, our Gospel reading from Mark 1:1-8 takes us to the very beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

In these verses, we encounter the proclamation of the Gospel and the ministry of John the Baptist, who plays a crucial role in preparing the way for the Lord.

Mark, known for his direct and concise style, wastes no time in introducing us to the essence of the Gospel – the arrival of God's Kingdom. The historical context reveals a sense of expectancy among some in Israel, echoing the community of Qumran by the Dead Sea. John's message aligns with this anticipation: God's reign is imminent, and preparation involves seeking forgiveness through the symbolic act of baptism.

Baptism, a familiar Jewish practice, transforms into a call for repentance in John's ministry. The waters of immersion symbolise a cleansing of the heart, a purification in anticipation of the coming Kingdom. Even Jesus, the Son of God, seeks baptism from John, highlighting the significance of this ritual in spiritual preparation.

Mark navigates the challenge of acknowledging John's greatness while emphasising Jesus' superiority. By drawing on the prophetic voices of Malachi and Isaiah, Mark positions John as a preparer for a figure even greater – Jesus himself. The Gospel thus unfolds as a story of preparation, echoing the words of Isaiah to "prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord."

In the larger narrative, the wilderness transforms from a physical location to the human heart. John's call to repentance becomes a call for a profound inner transformation. The 'way' that needs preparation is not a literal path but a spiritual one within our hearts, a conversion from sin to make room for the Lord.

John, resembling Elijah, not only calls for repentance but also confesses the identity of the One who follows him – Jesus, the Messiah. This coming One will baptise with the Holy Spirit, liberating humanity from various captivities and leading them into life-giving intimacy with God.

As we reflect on these Gospel passages, let us ponder how we can apply the message in our lives. How can we prepare the way for the Lord in our hearts? How can we embrace the call to repentance and inner transformation? In the midst of the busyness of the season, let us take a moment to revisit the longing for 'homecoming' within our souls.

May this Advent season be a time of profound spiritual preparation, as we eagerly anticipate the arrival of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

As I take up a new role as Principal of Our Lady Help of Christians in Eltham in 2024 I would like to thank Fr Joseph and the Parish Community of St. Peter Julian Eymard for all the kindness, support and friendship you have given to me over the last 15 years. I have loved every moment of working in such a vibrant and welcoming parish and I hope to be back visiting from time to time.
