REFLECTION

Next week, in our Parish, the Grade 3 children from St Richard's and St Peter Julian Eymard will receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation (commonly called Penance or Confession) is one of the seven sacraments of the Catholic Church, in which the faithful obtain absolution for the sins committed against God and neighbour and are reconciled with the community of the Church. By this sacrament, Christians believe they are freed from sins committed after Baptism.

Some of these concepts are incredibly difficult for young children to understand. Currently we teach Reconciliation around the concepts of, making right choices, saying sorry and forgiving people. By Grade 3, the children have quite a good understanding of the difference between right and wrong and are able to recognise the need to say sorry. When we talk about forgiveness, we describe it as letting go of hard feelings like anger, sadness or frustration that happen when you or someone else makes a bad choice. It's saying "Thank you" or "That's OK" when someone apologises and not staying upset about what they did. It's having patience with yourself and others, and recognising that no one is perfect – everyone makes mistakes. It's letting go of hurt feelings and moving forward. It does not mean that all of a sudden what someone did doesn't hurt or isn't wrong. What it does mean is that we have to try hard to find it in our hearts to give the person another chance.
