STILL CLINGING?

Towards the end of the American Civil War, when it was clear that the North would be victorious over the South, someone asked President Lincoln how he was going to treat the rebellious Confederates.

Lincoln answered, "I am going to treat them as if they had never been away."

After thousands of Union soldiers had died, after thousands of wives had lost their husbands, after thousands of children had lost their father, and after thousands of Northern soldiers had been permanently crippled, Lincoln was able to say, "I am going to treat them as if they had never been away."

Lincoln was not a regular churchgoer, yet few regular churchgoers could match his ability to forgive. His answer shames most of us.

For some very little offense, or for just some imagined offense, many of us are unable to forgive. Is there anyone who could match Lincoln's ability to forgive? There is.

The father in today's gospel (Luke 15:1 - 32) who had been abandoned by his son and who had given this son his son's inheritance which was almost immediately wasted. The father, by his action, forgave. He surely could have said, "I am going to treat him as if he had never been away."

And we? Do we still cling to some trifling offence?

Safeguarding Essentials is a 30-minute online training module for all clergy and volunteers within the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne.


This accessible and engaging resource provides clergy and volunteers with foundational knowledge and a clear understanding of their duty of care and expectations in relation to safeguarding children, young people and vulnerable persons from all forms of abuse and harm.

In the Catholic Church, Safeguarding Sunday occurs at the end of National Child Protection Week. It complements the wider Australian commemoration but has a distinctive emphasis. Safeguarding Sunday was affirmed by the members of the Church's recent Plenary Council, who in the decrees expressed "our profound sorrow that children and young people and vulnerable adults have been abused by clergy, religious and lay workers of the Catholic Church, and that religious leaders have failed to act sufficiently to prevent or respond to abuse". That focus naturally leads to the desire to make amends to the people who were abused and to ensure that in all the relationships with children within the Church they will be safe. The processes and protocols support that commitment to say "Never Again" to abuse. National Child Protection Week looks more broadly at the need of children for protection. Its theme this year is "Every child in every community needs a fair go". It asks us to reflect on the support that children need to grow into confident and trusting adults, free from abuse of every kind. This perspective brings home to us the horror of what was done in the Catholic Church by setting it in the broader need for protection in the Australian community as a whole. Our effectiveness in safeguarding children depends on changing deeprooted attitudes, particularly to recognise our own sinfulness and failure to protect children and to be attentive to the vulnerable people in our Church community. The Mass readings focus on this. We must also, however, make safe the environment in which they live. We do this by ensuring that they are listened to, are accompanied, that they are not vulnerable to predators and that protocols of conduct with children are strictly observed. The Plenary Council "calls on all Catholics to commit to ensuring that Church environments are safe and respectful". The ways of keeping safe must be imprinted on hands and feet, on fences and in timetables, as well as on minds. For children, being given a fair go means that they will be safe in the company they keep and in the activities they do. For adults who accompany them, ensuring that they have a fair go means constant care to keep them safe.

Queen Elizabeth was never reticent about acknowledging her Christian faith. Her annual Christmas message invariably focused on Jesus Christ as a model of humble and generous service. It was a model she strived to emulate throughout her long life.
