ReflectionLuke 17:11-19 Ten lepers....



Today's reflection comes from a summarized section of a biblical reflection about the ten lepers by Naveen Rebello SVD at the website listed below. Rebello reminds us that God's mercy and healing is limitless and universally given for all of humanity. God's limitless mercy shines through even amidst human ungratefulness and across boundaries we as human beings create. For example the leper who returned to say thanks was ostracized from both his community and because of his faith and beliefs. God does not condition his healing that if only the beneficiaries were to return to give thanks to him that he would heal them. God, who is merciful does his part; and he does it in the best way possible. From the human point of view, those who 'acknowledge' God's blessings are undoubtedly 'thankful' people, because they see the gifts of this world, the people around them, the events and experiences of this world as gifts that are given and not earned by their own merit. Indeed, the Samaritan saw his 'new existence' purely as a gift of God, an overflow of God's abundant mercy. "Gratitude is the beatitude of the heart." Having a grateful heart goes beyond saying merely "Thank

You". Grateful people truly acknowledge how richly they have been blessed and everything that *they have* and what *they are* comes from God. Such people pass on grateful memories of life, inspiring others to think of their source of blessing.

Humble, Healing and Merciful

"By the tender mercy of our God, the dawn from on high will break upon us, to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace."

(Luke 1:78-79)

How is God calling us to be a Christcentred Church in Australia that is humble, healing and merciful?

As we move into this second stage of the Plenary Council journey we continue to seek the wisdom of the Holy Spirit. Beginning in July 2019, we are called to reflect on Scripture,

Church teaching and our contemporary situation, in order to discern the answer to this question. The fruits of what is discerned during this time will help shape the agenda of the first session of Plenary Council in October 2020.

This National Theme for Discernment is inspired by the voices of the People of God who expressed a deep and faith-filled trust in God and a need for lament and healing within the Church, acknowledging the sexual abuse crisis as a turning point for the Church in Australia. It identified the need for relationship and reconciliation among many within the Catholic community, and with the wider Australian society, particularly with Australia's First Peoples and with all of creation. A desire was expressed for stronger prayer and sacramental life and more effective outreach to those who seek healing, as a renewed openness to and sign of God's mercy.
