Reflection

This weekend Jesus talks to us about the destruction of the temple. The temple is central to many of Jesus' teachings. The imagery of a temple is a nice one, we all have temples. Some have been given to us, others we have built for ourselves. Sometimes our temples are people, places, values and beliefs or dreams. They are the things that we think provide structure and order in our lives, they give meaning, identity and provide security.

At least we think they do, until they fall.

In today's gospel the crowds were speaking about the temple, its beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God. It is what structured their community. It gave identity and meaning. It was the center of Jewish life. Jesus looks at it and says, "The days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down." Jesus is speaking about more than just the physical temple in Jerusalem. The Jerusalem temple includes every temple you and I have.

Change has a way of pushing us into the future. Many people will begin looking for signs about the future. What do I do? How do I get through this? If we are not careful we will soon be living in a future we do not yet have. We will be living in a future created in our heads. That is not Jesus' response. When Jesus describes things that will happen he is not asking us to speculate about the future. He is offering signs that call us to be faithful in the present.




