## ANTI-POVERTY WEEK October 14-20<sup>th</sup> 2018

Anti-Poverty week is a week where all Australians are encouraged to organise or take part in an activity aiming to highlight or overcome issues of poverty and hardship here in Australia or overseas. It was established in Australia as an expansion of the UN's annual International Day for the Eradication of Poverty.

The main aims of Anti-Poverty Week are to:

Strengthen public understanding of the causes and consequences of poverty and hardship around the world and in Australia and

*Encourage research, discussion and action to address these problems, including action by individuals, communities, organisations and governments.* 

Poverty and severe hardship affects more than a million Australians. Around the world, more than a billion people are desperately poor. In Anti-Poverty Week, you too can help fight poverty and hardship.

Pope Francis has instituted the annual World Day of the Poor for November 19<sup>th</sup>. In his inaugural message for the day (2017) he says:

Blessed, therefore, are the open hands that embrace the poor and help them; they are the hands that bring hope. Blessed are the hands that reach beyond every barrier of culture, religion and nationality, and pour the balm of consolation over the wound of humanity. Blessed are the open hands that ask nothing in exchange., with no 'ifs' or 'buts' or 'maybes' they are the hands that call down God's blessings upon their brothers and sisters.
