# FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT 14th March 2021 Issue No. 7

Our Gospel Reading for this weekend, asks us to reflect and to really look, if we are to see. The fact that Jesus sees this blind man is in itself remarkable. Often, we prefer to pass by homeless without seeing them or pretending to look the other way, because it is painful to see misery—to see a man or woman so far gone that there is no hope of restoration.

This man had become part of the background, but Jesus sees him. This is the first step toward the man's healing. What makes this miracle even more incredible is the fact that this man was born blind. If his blindness had occurred more recently, healing might seem possible—but as this blind man will point out, "Since the world began it has never been heard of that anyone opened the eyes of someone born blind".

The concept of not being able to see is an interesting one and one that can be explored even further. For me I find myself contemplating, when have I not seen something that I could have done something about it. It is about having the courage to find a voice, to stand up against something unjust. This Lent is a great time to be more, to others and put others first.


