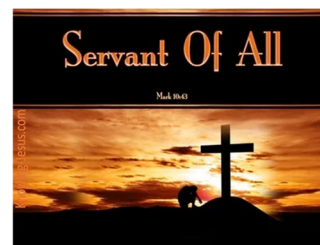

Reflection:

Mark 10:35-45 (shorter form Mark 10:42-45)

**Jesus teaches that those who wish to be great must
be the servant of all.**



In this Sunday's Gospel, James and John ask to be given seats of honor when Jesus enters into his glory. Once again, the disciples seem to be selective in what they hear Jesus say. They want to share Jesus' glory, but do not appear to understand that his glory will be preceded by his suffering.

Jesus notes their lack of understanding and predicts the suffering they will endure for the sake of the Gospel. Jesus says that the honor they seek is not his to give. When the other ten hear what James and John have asked, Mark reports that they are indignant. Jesus takes the opportunity to teach them.

Jesus explains the importance of service and sacrifice in the life of a disciple. In particular, he seems to be preparing the Twelve for their leadership roles in the emerging Christian community. Echoing the Gospel we heard several weeks ago Jesus acknowledges that his teaching is countercultural. In today's Gospel, Jesus contrasts the dynamics within the community of disciples with those shown by the rulers of the Gentiles.

Following Jesus' example of sacrificial love continues to be countercultural in our day as well.

We might take this opportunity to consider our models of authority and examine our own exercise of authority. On whose example do we model our leadership?

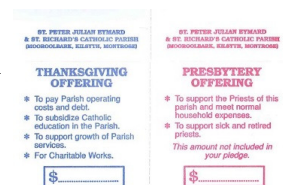

Fr Joseph's Homily

29th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B, 2021

In today's gospel (Mark 10:34-45), we saw how James and John were not happy with their place in life. They wanted to sit at the right hand and the left hand of Jesus when he came into his glory. They were too ambitious. They wanted to be "someone." Alexander Pope once called ambition, "The glorious fault of angels and of gods."

Of course, James and John wanted to be happy, and they thought that achieving a high place would make them happy; but the Hungarians know better, they have a proverb which says, "Where ambition ends, then happiness begins."

As long as we are over-ambitious, we cannot be happy with our present place in life and we have no time to be of help to others.

Sometimes, when we ask help from an over-ambitious person and he or she says he (or she) is very busy, we can almost read in his or her face the words, "Don't bother me."

Ambition does not seem to allow us to share our time in helping others, for ambition's only concern is self, self and self.

Let us concern ourselves with building character, not with building success for ourselves. Ralph Waldo Emerson who is an American essayist said, "Character is that which can do without success and recognition." Let us concern ourselves with building character, not with building a reputation. I have visited many parishioners in the past years and most of them have been elderly parishioners, I have often been touched by their characters of being wonderful persons. Their goodness, kindness, simplicity, humility, generosity, sacrifice, care and love for God, for our parish and for me are inspirations for me and many of us. They are the gifts, blessings and treasures of our parish.
