Blessed are you who are poor

When Jesus introduces the Beatitudes he draws distinctions under the headings of 'poor' and 'rich'. The poor are hungry now and they weep now. Their reward is in the after-life at peace in the presence of God. Their hunger will be satisfied and their weeping will be replaced with laughter. The rich on the other hand are not hungry now, they laugh now. At another time in another place, they will go hungry and they will mourn and weep.

Weeping is usually connected in the prophetic literature with the disasters that flow from "ungodly" decisions. In our times, there are many weeping over "ungodly" decisions in relation to asylum seekers and carbon emissions and just in these past few weeks, the floods in Far North Queensland and the bushfires in parts of our wonderful land. Laughter seems a remote possibility for many displaced people of our world. We are reminded today of the gospel imperative to work and pray that war torn and climate affected countries will once again resonate with the sound of happy laughter

It is only in handling life's challenges with dignity, grace, and single-minded focus on the gospel that we find blessing or happiness.

"STRIVING TO BE A WELCOMING CATHOLIC COMMUNITY"



DO YOU SOMETIMES WONDER WHAT THE CATHOLIC CHURCH IS ALL ABOUT OR IS ON ABOUT? WHAT IT BELIEVES & TEACHES? PERHAPS FEEL A FRUSTRATION WITH THE CHALLENGES THE CHURCH PRESENTLY SEEMS TO ATTRACT OR INVITE? OR YOU SIMPLY ASK - WHAT DOES JESUS MAKE OF ALL OF THIS!?!

Perhaps some such thoughts have kept recurring for you – perhaps out of admiration for a friend or neighbour or wondering about the faith & practice of your partner or wider family or friends; or caring for the faith growth of your children. Even plain curiosity, frustration or puzzle... Or you may have fallen away from Church life some years ago & would like to re-join but feel a bit lost or left behind, wondering if it now all now makes sense and if I will be accepted or can receive the Sacraments.

It is possible that your questions and feelings can be answered through joining RCIA, "The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults", offered by the Parish through the year.

If you or one of your family or friends have persistent questions like this, you might think of joining the Programme as an "Enquirer" or encouraging your friend or family member to join. The Programme begins with a few Enquiry or Discernment Evenings; then, if you decide to proceed to the full Programme as a Candidate, you will be invited to meet with the RCIA Team. These are a small group of parishioners who companion and support those who wish to learn more about Jesus, discover more about the Scriptures and the life of the Church and their own inner selves & call, and who may eventually decide to join the Parish as full members of the Church. This Process of prayer, learning, depthing, sharing and discovering is called the Catechumenal Journey with a meeting at a Parish Mass each weekend over about 6 months for the Gathering Prayers, Scriptures & Homily, then moving to the Parish House to consider the person of Jesus & the teaching and life of the Church in the light of God's Word in the Scriptures, so seeking to grow in understanding, faith & spiritual awareness and in the sense of Church as Community of Faith, Mission & Service.
