Sunday, 18th July 2021

'He took pity on them because they were like sheep without a shepherd.'

The Gospel today is the one I regularly share with all the teachers I lead as the basis for their own spirituality. I ask teachers to reflect carefully at what Jesus feels and what he does in this gospel passage. We are told, 'He had compassion for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd.' In my years as a primary school teacher, I often feel this way about my students. Young students often come to school with uncertainty and insecurities. There is a real sense of vulnerability as these students now leave the family nest and begin to navigate this complex world that they are living in. They are 'like sheep without a shepherd', leaderless. What adult would really like to navigate those years again?

The Gospel then gives us Jesus' response, 'and he set himself to teach them'. We know from the previous verse that he teaches with compassion. He teaches not to show how much he knows, or to brainwash but to offer the crowd a way out of the experience of being lost. Jesus' teaching is his greatest gift to these people, perhaps more important than his miracles.

Even those who are not professional teachers can experience themselves in a 'shepherding' role whenever they show someone how to do something, provided they are motivated by compassion and not arrogance; provided their teaching is genuinely educative and not an opportunity to 'put down'. The image of Jesus as the 'Good Shepherd' is a model for teachers, for parents and all who exercise Christian ministry.

Covid 19 – Update for parishioners, 18th July 2021

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

As you are aware the Victorian Government and the Victorian Public Health Office have changed some restrictions for Victoria.

However,

MASKS must continue be worn inside our Church (unless you have a medical exemption).

Social distancing still remains and must be adhered to at all Masses. Masks should also be carried at all times and worn if social distancing cannot be maintained outdoors.
Mass numbers are no longer capped, however registrations are still required. Please ensure that you arrive at the Church with sufficient time to complete the registration process.
The new mandatory **Services Victoria QR Code** remains in place. This is the only QR code that should be used when entering our Church and we ask that you bring your mobile phone with you. If you or your phone do not have the capacity to download this app or sign in to this code, we will have people at each Mass who will be able to either step you through this or sign you in using an IPad.

We have also included the new QR Code in the Newsletter, so if you would like to sign in prior to coming to the Church, ie in your home or in the carpark, you will save time and avoid blockages in the Church Foyer.

Hand sanitizing is still an essential part of our **Covid Safe Plan** and by following all of the advice above, this will keep you and our parish community safe and is critical to allowing our Church to remain open.

The Parish Leadership Team thanks you all for your patience and understanding in what has been a very difficult and challenging time. We are very pleased that we can return to increased numbers at Masses from this weekend and this has been achieved by the continued support of our parishioners in getting us through another period of restrictions.
