John 20:19-31 Thomas believes because he sees Jesus.

Today's Gospel tells us that Jesus appeared to the disciples on several occasions after they discovered that his tomb was empty. Part of the mystery of Jesus' Resurrection is that he appeared to his disciples not as a spirit but in bodily form. The bodily form was not one that the disciples recognized though. In John's Gospel, Mary of Magdala does not recognize that the figure standing before her is Jesus until he speaks to her. Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace and the gift of the Holy Spirit. In doing so, Jesus commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." During the meeting, Jesus also shows the integral connection between forgiveness of sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit. The story of Thomas illustrates our Christian experience today: We are called to believe without

seeing. In fact, all Christians after the first witnesses have been called to believe without seeing. Thomas's doubt compelled him to want hard evidence that the Jesus who appeared to the disciples after his death was indeed the same Jesus who had been crucified. Thomas is given the opportunity to act on that desire. He is our witness that Jesus is really risen.

Our faith is based on the witness of the Church that has preceded us, beginning with Thomas and the first disciples. Through Baptism we receive the same Holy Spirit that Jesus brought to the first disciples. We are among those who are "blessed" because we believe without having seen.

FATHER JOSEPH'S HOMILY

TRUST IN HIS MERCY

Today is the second Sunday of Easter. Today is also known as the Divine Mercy Sunday: Pope John Paul 11, himself a devotee of the Divine Mercy, proclaimed this commemoration on April 30, 2000 during the canonization of St. Fustina Kowalska, a Polish nun who experienced apparitions of Jesus and His call to trust in His Divine Mercy. Saint Faustina was named an "apostle of the Divine Mercy: and the faithful were encouraged to pray her exclamation to the Divine Mercy, "Jesus, I trust in You."

On the eve of the Divine Mercy Sunday in 2005, Pope John Paul 11 died. Pope Benedict XV1 beatified him on a Divine Mercy Sunday in 2011. Our present pope, Pope Francis, canonized Pope John 11 on April 27, 2014, also a Divine Mercy Sunday.

In today's Gospel, the Divine Mercy is on full display. The Risen Lord appears to the disciples. He did not accuse them of their betrayal. He showed them his wounds, not to put them on a guilt trip but to shower them with mercy, to assure them it was for them (and us) that He bore those wounds.

To top it all, He even commissioned them to be bearers of the same mercy by being agents of forgiveness of sins.

Jesus, I trust in You !

Just a caveat. Jesus calls us to trust in His mercy, not the presume it. Trust is the attitude of a lover.

Presumption is the attitude of a user. When we presume something, we become complacent. We become abusive.

A husband who presumes the love of his wife willingly commits infidelity , thinking, "After all, she will take me back." A child wo presumes his parents' dedication to his welfare squanders his allowance, thinking, "After all, they can't bear to see me suffer." A Christian who presumes God's mercy willingly sins, thinking, "After all, I can always go to confession."
