Why do they say that, "a man's best friend is his dog?" It's because a dog is always happy to see it's owner; the dog gives unconditional love; is non-judgmental, never criticizes.

Fr Joseph's Homily Twenty Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B, 2021

Wilhelmina: you belong to all these people".


