THE GOOD THAT WE HAVE FAILED TO DO

In today's gospel Jesus tells us about a fig tree that bore no fruit for the past three years.

The owner told his assistant to cut it down since the tree was occupying valuable space which could not be used for other fruit-bearing trees.

The fig tree was not poisoning the other trees. It was not an ugly tree, but the owner wanted the tree cut down because it was a useless tree.

It did no good. It helped nobody. The tree took nutrition from the soil, but it gave back nothing in return for what it had received.

The tree was like those people in the gospel who did nothing bad, but neither did they do any good. Jesus said of people like this, "I was hungry and you gave me no food. I was thirsty and you gave me no drink." (Matthew 25:42-43)

You did not push me into starvation - but neither did you rescue me from starvation. You did no evil - but you did no good (and that is evil). In the beginning of each Mass we ask God to forgive us not only "for the evil we have done" but also "for the good that we have

failed to do." The fig tree failed to yield figs. In the twelfth chapter of Matthew, Jesus says, "He who is not with me is against me." Perhaps we could say,

"He who is not doing good is doing bad." This is what the barren fig tree was doing. It was doing no good,

and for the owner, this was bad - and he wanted the tree to be cut down.

The Acts of the Apostles tell us (Acts 10:32) that Jesus "went about doing good." If we Christians do not go about doing good - beyond the limits of our own family and relatives - then we cannot say that our lives are really Christian.
