# COVIDSafe Summer –

Restrictions apply from 11:59pm 17 February 2021 From 11:59pm 17 February 2021 Victoria returns to COVIDSafe Summer restrictions – with some revised conditions.

These restrictions are designed to balance allowing Victorians to get back to doing the things they love while also putting in place measures to protect all that Victorians have worked so hard for. This means that:

- There are no restrictions on reasons to leave home.
- You must carry a face mask with you when you leave home.
- Face masks continue to be mandatory indoors (other than residential homes). This includes workplaces.
- Face masks are also mandatory outdoors when you can't keep 1.5 metres distance from other people (except with people from your own home).
- You can have up to 5 visitors to your home per day. There is no limit on the number of households those people come from.
- Up to 20 people can meet outdoors in a public place. There is no limit on the number of households those people come from.
- Schools and education providers are open
- Weddings, funerals and religious gatherings can occur with no limits on guests or attendees in commercial venues. To ensure people can keep 1.5 metres distance, the venue must apply the two square metre rule. If conducted in a private home, the private gathering limit applies (5 visitors, the celebrant and a photographer are not counted).

# What is Lent?

Lent is a 40-day period of spiritual preparation leading up to Easter in which many Christians reflect on Christ's death and resurrection.

While many people use Lent as a way to better themselves (through giving something up), the Lent season isn't really supposed to be about us at all. Rather, it's a time to reflect on what Jesus did. And it's meant to be a time of self-sacrifice, denial and repentance. It's not about deciding what to give up for Lent. It's about deciding to turn our focus back to Christ, and finding ways to grow in relationship with him, be more like him, and follow him better. This doesn't mean we should skip giving up something for Lent, of course. Giving up something for Lent is still a great practice!

We just need to be careful to avoid making giving up something for Lent all about us and what we can do, rather than about what Jesus did for us when he died on the cross.

Catholic Lent is meant to be a season of self-sacrifice, denial and repentance. It's an opportunity to grow closer to God, to remember his life and death, and to focus more on him and less on ourselves and our busy schedules. However, depending on what things you choose to give up for Lent, Lent could help you: grow closer to God, learn to trust Him more, break free of specific sins you struggle with, become more like Christ, grow in gratitude, or develop a greater understanding of those who are different than you. Or, you could just finish the 40 days with a sense of accomplishment that you were able to complete a challenge you made to yourself.

Many people simply choose one of the popular things to give up for Lent, such as chocolate, coffee or social media. Others want something a little more meaningful, such as giving up alcohol for Lent or trying to give up worry for Lent.

But before you decide what to give up for Lent, you want to make sure you have an idea that's perfect for YOU. Something that will actually help you, not just frustrate you for 6 weeks.
