Matthew 10:26-33
Jesus assures the Twelve that God cares about them.

We read today's Gospel in the context of last week's Gospel in which Jesus sent the twelve disciples to proclaim the kingdom of heaven. In between last week's reading and today's reading, Jesus has predicted that the disciples will face difficulties in their mission. Many people will not receive them well, even within the land of Israel. Even family members will turn away from the disciples because of the disciples' commitment to Jesus and the kingdom. Today's Gospel offers the disciples consolation against this difficult truth. This section of Matthew's Gospel should be read in the context of Matthew's intended audience, a Jewish-Christian community. The Gospel alludes to the dangers and persecutions that this community has most likely already faced and will continue to face. To reassure this community, Matthew recalls for them the encouraging words of Jesus that we read today. In this Gospel passage, Jesus might be understood as putting suffering in perspective. The disciples of

as putting suffering in perspective. The disciples of Jesus are called upon to keep their focus on God. Those who can harm the body do not have ultimate power; God does. Still persecution and suffering can not be avoided or prevented. But Jesus reassures his disciples that God knows and cares about what happens to his children.

We might not face the same type of persecution, but we do experience difficulties as we endeavour to live a Christian life. Sometimes we let the opinions of others prevent us from doing what we know to be right. We need the reminder that what God thinks about us is more important. We are reassured by the promise that God cares for us and protects us.

As of 27th and 28th June, 50 people are allowed at each Mass, including children & musicians. In mid July approx. 100 people will be allowed to attend Mass.

The parish will be updated by the Archdiocese prior to the easing of this restriction.

Parishioners <u>must</u> email or phone to book your attendance.

Given limited numbers at each mass please state your mass time preference -

6 pm Saturday Sun. 9am & 11am, or the additional Mass at 5pm on Sunday.

Please leave your full name and contact details clearly on the telephone if you do not have access to a computer and state your preference Mass with 1st & 2nd choice.

We will do our best to accommodate your request.

We ask that you please adhere to hygiene requirements - hand sanitiser and wipes available at the church and social distancing signage in the Church.

Family groups who live in the same household must sit together.

Individuals to sit where marked by a green cross on the pews.

The church will be open 30 minutes before Mass.

We ask parishioners to kindly leave at the conclusion of Mass to allow for the cleaning of the church. After Mass please practise social distancing and only chat with Fr Joseph and other parishioners if it is really necessary.

No cuppas after Mass until further notice.

We will have the usual envelopes in the church on the collection weekend and anyone not yet attending Mass can drop their donation in a marked envelope at the Parish House (front door letter box).



The <u>Vinnies CEO Sleepout</u> is a one-night event over one of the longest and coldest nights of the year (Thursday 18 June). Hundreds of CEOs, business owners as well as community and government leaders sleep outdoors to raise funds and support the many Australians who are experiencing homelessness and people at risk of homelessness.

By the numbers:

- •27% of homeless people in Australia are under 18 years of age
- •1 in 200 people are homeless on any given night in Australia
- •Almost half of all homeless people are women
- •Over 17,000 kids under the age have no home
- •14% of Australians live below the poverty line
- •30% of people experiencing homelessness are living in severely crowded homes

Last year, the Vinnies CEO Sleepout raised \$7.9 million for people experiencing homelessness and people at risk of homelessness. Now in its 15th year, the restrictions caused by COVID-19 have meant the event has had to move to a more interactive, online format. Participants have been asked to nominate an alternate sleeping option (their couch, backyard or car) and will share the experience through an interactive live stream program, logging in with others all around the country.

Participating in his first Vinnies CEO Sleepout,
Archbishop Peter A Comensoli is sleeping out in his car to help raise awareness
and funds for the important cause. "It's a little bit of discomfort for a good bit of
awareness," he said.
